“Bible Basics” | #2: The Jews & The Law

All of history is moving to the point where God’s plan of salvation and redemption for the universe will be complete, when, as the last book in the Bible says, “*Look, God’s home is now among his people! He will live with them, and they will be his people. God himself will be with them. He will wipe every tear from their eyes, and there will be no more death or sorrow or crying or pain. All these things are gone forever.*” (Revelation 21:3-4)

Calling of Abram (Abraham)
Genesis 12:1-4

Promises to Abraham

1. I will make you into a great nation...
2. I will make your name great...
3. I will bless those who bless you, and curse those who curse you...
4. ... all the peoples of the earth will be blessed through you.

A Great Nation means kids... Genesis 15:1-6

Genesis 15:6: “*And Abram believed the Lord, and the Lord counted him as righteous because of his faith.*”

Righteousness: God’s perfection; flawless, holy, pure, clean, totally without blemish or sin.

Credited: settling a monetary account through a payment.

Believed: heartfelt inner confidence that God is who He says He is and will do what He says He will do. It means total dependence and reliance upon.

- Belief is built on fact, not feeling.
- Amount of faith is not as important as in whom you have placed your trust.
- Faith often moves us to action.

The Law & Us

1. The Law Condemns all Men
Exodus 20:3; Matthew 22:36-40

True or False	First Commandment (Exodus 20:3). I have always put the Lord first and I have always given the Lord first place in my life. I have never let anything or anyone else take the place that God should have in my life.
True or False	Third Commandment (Exodus 20:7). I have never taken the Lord's Name in vain or used God's Name in a careless or thoughtless way. I have always treated God's Name with utmost reverence and respect.
True or False	Fifth Commandment (Exodus 20:12). I have always honored my parents and have given them the highest respect. I have never disobeyed my parents and when I was younger I never needed or deserved discipline.
True or False	Eighth Commandment (Exodus 20:15). I have never stolen anything from anyone. I have never taken anything that did not belong to me. I have always respected the property and possessions of others.
True or False	Ninth Commandment (Exodus 20:16). I have never given a false witness against anyone. I have never said something about another person which I knew was not true. I have never lied; I have always been honest about everything. I only speak what is true.
True or False	Tenth Commandment (Exodus 20:17). I have never coveted or desired something that someone else had. I have never had a strong desire for my neighbor's house or swimming pool or boat or automobile or wife or husband or anything else belonging to my neighbor. I have always been totally content and satisfied with what God has given to me.

We are all lawbreakers. Romans 3:19

2. The Law is not bad. It reflects God.

3. The penalty for breaking the law is death.
Exodus 21; Romans 1:29-32

4. The Good News! Jesus Christ died for Lawbreakers.

Galatians 3:13; 1 Timothy 1:15; Romans 6:23

5. Two ways to eternal life! (Really, only one...)

A. *Legal*: A person may obtain eternal life by keeping God's commandments (by obeying God's law perfectly every day of his or her life).

B. *Grace*: A person may obtain eternal life by believing on the Lord Jesus Christ and receiving Him as Savior.

6. Purpose of Law is NOT to save us but show us our sin.

7. We live by the law of love.
