

Discussion Guide: Trinity – The Yahweh Fusion – Part 2

Opening Question

- When you hear the word *wilderness*, what comes to mind emotionally—not spiritually, but emotionally?

Section 1: Why the Wilderness?

“God didn’t accidentally bring His people into the wilderness. He chose it.”

Discussion Prompts

- Why do you think God intentionally led Israel *away* from familiar places and into isolation?
- The wilderness removed distractions, trade routes, and safety nets. What distractions does God often remove in our lives today?
- The lesson says the wilderness is a place of **dependency**. How do we usually respond when our independence is challenged?
- Why do you think we often assume that distance from comfort equals distance from God?

Scripture Engagement

- Read **Exodus 19:1–2**
 - What stands out about where God chooses to meet His people?

Section 2: Sinai – Provision Where There Is Nothing

“Sinai had no rivers, no springs, no natural benefit—and yet nothing was lacking.”

Discussion Prompts

- What does the provision of water from the rock tell us about God’s ability versus our environment?
- How does this challenge the idea that we need the ‘right conditions’ before trusting God?
- The lesson mentions that Sinai is still visibly scorched. Why is physical evidence important to faith or is it?

Reflection Question

- Where in your life are you asking God to move you *out* of a place instead of trusting Him *within* it?

Section 3: Jerusalem – Dependency Revisited

“Even the holy city was built in a place that couldn’t sustain itself.”

Discussion Prompts

- Why do you think God repeatedly chooses locations that require ongoing dependence?
- What happens when God’s provision is replaced with human solutions?

- Can blessing ever become a substitute for trust?

Section 4: The Trust-O-Meter

“Dependency isn’t what we say—it’s what we do when God disrupts our plans.”

Discussion Prompts

- If God asked you to go into the wilderness without details, what would your first questions be?
- Why do we often label obedience as ‘unwise’ when it feels risky?
- What does 100% dependence actually look like in daily life?

Personal Reflection

- What is one area where you say you trust God—but still keep control?

Section 5: The Fusion Aspect – Moses as Image Bearer

“Moses wasn’t Yahweh—but he carried Yahweh’s presence.”

Discussion Prompts

- What stands out to you about Moses’ fusion with God?
- Why do you think God allowed others to visibly see Moses’ transformation?
- How does Moses reflect what Paul talks about in **Ephesians 4:20–24**?
- Why is transformation meant to be *desirable* to others?

Section 6: Structure Is Not the Enemy

“God didn’t just give presence—He gave structure.”

Discussion Prompts

- Why do people often resist structure when it comes to faith?
- How does God’s law reveal both His holiness and our need for Him?
- The lesson says sin creates a wedge in fusion. How does that play out practically?

Section 7: The Tent of Meeting – Face to Face

“Face to face doesn’t mean eyesight—it means intimacy.”

Discussion Prompts

- How does the explanation of ‘nostril to nostril’ change how you understand intimacy with God?
- Why do you think God met Moses *outside* the camp?
- What would it look like to intentionally create a ‘tent of meeting’ in your life today?

Section 8: Priesthood and Our Calling

“The priesthood didn’t end—it was fulfilled.”

“The Law didn’t end – it was fulfilled.”

Discussion Prompts

- What does it mean that Jesus is both King and High Priest?
- How does being called a *royal priesthood* change how we view everyday life?
- What does ongoing consecration look like—not perfection, but alignment?
Alignment leads us into his perfection...

Closing Reflection

“The wilderness, the fusion, and the structure are not restrictions—they are invitations.”

Final Questions

- Which part of this lesson challenged you the most?
- Where might God be inviting you into deeper dependence right now?
- What would it look like to stop rushing the wilderness and let God finish His work?

Closing Prayer Prompt

“God, help us not escape the wilderness—but meet You in it.”

Questions

2. How does this challenge the belief that provision depends on location or circumstance?

3. Where in your life do you feel like you are in a “barren place” right now?

Section 3: Jerusalem – A City Built on Dependence

Key Idea: Jerusalem itself cannot sustain life without God’s provision.

Reflection

1. Why do you think God consistently chooses places that *require* dependence?

2. What happens when people replace God’s provision with their own solutions?

Section 4: The Trust-O-Meter

Key Idea: Dependency is revealed by obedience, not intention.

1. If God asked you to step into uncertainty without details, what would be your first concern?

Section 5: The Fusion Aspect – Moses as Image Bearer

Section 6: Structure Received From God

Key Idea: God gave law, order, and instruction to protect the fusion between Himself and His people.

Reflection

3. How can structure actually *protect* intimacy with God?

Section 7: The Tent of Meeting – Face to Face

Key Idea: “Face to face” represents intimacy and shared presence, not physical sight.

Scripture

Read **Genesis 2:6–7** and **Exodus 33:20**

Questions

1. How does the explanation of “nostril to nostril” deepen your understanding of intimacy with God?
2. Why do you think Moses met God *outside* the camp?
3. What could a modern “tent of meeting” look like in your daily life?

Section 8: Priesthood and Our Calling

Key Idea: Through Jesus, believers are now part of a royal priesthood.

Scripture

Read **Hebrews 4:14–16** and **1 Peter 2:9**

Reflection

1. What does it mean that Jesus is both King and High Priest?
2. How does being part of a royal priesthood change how you view everyday life?
3. What does ongoing consecration look like practically?

Final Reflection

Key Idea: Wilderness, fusion, and structure reveal how God chooses to dwell with humanity.

Closing Questions

1. Which section of this lesson challenged you the most?
2. Where might God be inviting you into deeper dependence right now?
3. What is one step you can take this week to respond?
