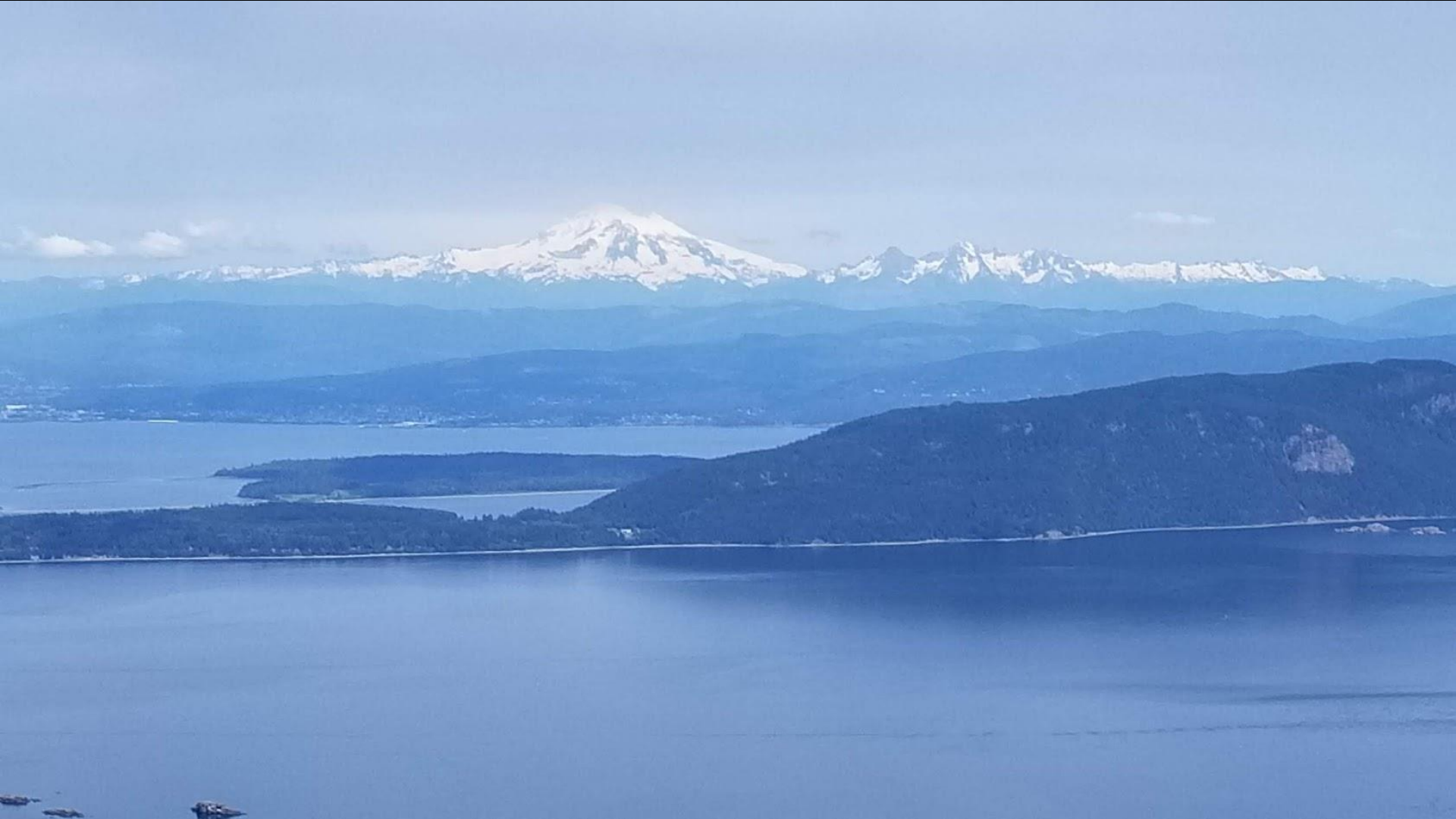


## Acts of the flesh

- **Sins directed against God:** idolatry and witchcraft
- **Sins directed against others:** hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions, and envy
- **Sins directed at our own bodies:** sexual immorality, impurity, debauchery, drunkenness and orgies

## Fruit of the Spirit

- **Relationship with God:** Love, Joy, Peace
- **Relationship with others:** patient, kindness, goodness
- **Relationship with ourselves:** faithful, gentle, and self-controlled


