3. Not setting the heart to seek God...

· leaves you ravaged by your own folly. (2 Chron. 10)

· leaves those around you ravaged by your folly. (2 Chron. 10:16–11:4)

• leaves you disoriented to eternal good, pursuing wrath-accumulating immorality, inviting the discipline of God. (2 Chron. 11:18–12:5)

· produces incomplete repentance. (2 Chron. 12:6–14)
