- Most of us don't have a Christian work ethic.
- If people don't know about Christ because of you, you'll hit highs and lows in your life.
- Often what we're looking for God is not a part of it.
- Don't let your pride keep you from being vulnerable; If you're struggling, let others know to help hold you up, that's what we're called to do as believers.



What Do You Value?

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- Your value in God is based on how you respond to His command in your life.
- Though we are one body, He's given each of us an individual value.
- Your value is that you've been saved by Jesus.
- Your success or lack thereof has nothing to do with what He's already done.



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- We measure our value based on success (things, money, house, cars, etc).
- Nothing is new under the sun; the same struggles from back then are the same now, just looks different.
- The old generation dealt with things face to face, the current generation uses a screen.



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- You left God's value system to follow a delusional value system.
- We sacrificed holiness for religion and "following the crowd".
- God has a measure that everyone will be judged by.
- People won't be measured based on ***your*** measure.



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- God can use us for good, even if we come from a toxic environment (Abraham, David, Jesus, Paul etc).
- Your value can't be connected to people and what they can do for you, it must be in God.
- Your calling shouldn't be connected to how much you'll earn in what you do, it should be in saving the lost ***through*** what you do.
