
Ephesians 3:3-5


⁷ In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace ⁸ that he richly poured out on us with all wisdom and understanding. 9 He made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he purposed in Christ ¹⁰ as a plan for the right time—to bring everything together in Christ, both things in heaven and things on earth in him.

13 But now in Christ Jesus, you who were far away have been brought near by the blood of Christ. 14 For he is our peace, who made both groups one and tore down the dividing wall of hostility. In his flesh, 15 he made of no effect the law consisting of commands and expressed in regulations, so that he might create in himself one new man from the two, resulting in peace. 16 He did this so that he might reconcile both to God in one body through the cross by which he put the hostility to death.









"Now I truly understand that God doesn't show favoritism, ³⁵ but in every nation the person who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶ He sent the message to the Israelites, proclaiming the good news of peace through Jesus Christ—he is Lord of all.






"It was really the Christians who were the worst," she said. "It was really just sad to see this critical display of judgement from Christians, and I don't understand what would inspire that, aside from something that's more egoic, because that isn't Christlike, to judge people or judge people's journey. You would think that most Christians would be happy for you when you come to this point in your life, especially when you get baptized."

"Baptism is so beautiful and it's such a big landmark in time," she continued. "For me, at least, it was one of the most important days of my life, so it's strange that these handful of negative, critical Christians would come at me in such a public way."

²⁷ For those of you who were baptized into Christ have been clothed with Christ. ²⁸ There is no Jew or Greek, slave or free, male and female; since you are all one in Christ Jesus. ²⁹ And if you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's seed, heirs according to the promise.

I fear for churches that say "We are creating community." That's like saying, "We're working to make sure the sun rises." It's already done. I also fear for the Christian desperately wanting to feel community. That's understandable but tragic.

"Why were they doomed in their quest? Because they didn't treat unity as a fact to be developed but as a feeling to be gauged. Thus, every example of lived-out unity was only useful until the next time they felt left out or unappreciated."

"The Greco-Roman world's religious views were open and seemingly tolerant-everyone had his or her own God. The practices of the culture were quite brutal, however. ... By contrast, Christians insisted that there was only one true god, the dying Savior Jesus Christ. Their lives and practices were, however, remarkably welcoming to those that the culture marginalized. The early Christians mixed people from different races and classes in ways that seemed scandalous to those around them.





"I am free indeed."


Theme of the whole Epistle:
