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



Amos reveals the holiness of God and the need for listening in stillness. "The Lord, the God of Armies, is his name...He has spoken. Silence!...The Lord your God has spoken."




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
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A locust swarm was one of the most dreaded plagues of the ancient East. As a swarm made its ravenous way across the land, people despaired because it was an enemy against whom they were helpless. When the plague was past, suffering and death by famine followed. This misery was intensified in Israel, for locusts were recognized as God's instrument of punishment for covenant violations (Deut. 28:38, 42; cf. Amos 4:9; Joel 1:1–7). – Don Sunukjian, *Amos*

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

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

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⁷ He showed me this: The Lord was standing there by a vertical wall with a plumb line in his hand. 8 The Lord asked me, "What do you see, Amos?" I replied, "A plumb line." Then the Lord said, "I am setting a plumb line among my people Israel; I will no longer spare them: ⁹ Isaac's high places will be deserted, and Israel's sanctuaries will be in ruins; I will rise up against the house of Jeroboam with a sword."


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


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¹⁸ The one who lives with integrity will be helped, but one who distorts right and wrong will suddenly fall.

Proverbs 28 CSB

¹⁰ Amaziah the priest of Bethel sent word to King Jeroboam of Israel, saying, "Amos has conspired against you right here in the house of Israel. The land cannot endure all his words, ¹¹ for Amos has said this: 'Jeroboam will die by the sword, and Israel will certainly go into exile from its homeland." ¹² Then Amaziah said to Amos, "Go away, you seer! Flee to the land of Judah. Earn your living and give your prophecies there, ¹³ but don't ever prophesy at Bethel again, for it is the king's sanctuary and a royal temple."

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¹⁴ So Amos answered Amaziah, "I was not a prophet or the son of a prophet; rather, I was a herdsman, and I took care of sycamore figs. ¹⁵ But the Lord took me from following the flock and said to me, 'Go, prophesy to my people Israel.'"

¹⁶ Now hear the word of the Lord. You say:

Do not prophesy against Israel;
do not preach against the house of Isaac.

¹⁷ Therefore, this is what the Lord says: Your wife will be a prostitute in the city, your sons and daughters will fall by the sword, and your land will be divided up with a measuring line. You yourself will die on pagan soil, and Israel will certainly go into exile from its homeland.

The Conclusion: trust in government leads to false security. From "cutting of the king's hay" to "the house of Jeroboam" to "Bethel is the king's sanctuary and a royal temple," God is judging those who find security in human government.

Had Amaziah responded differently, had he repented at Amos' word, he might have been spared (Amos 5:4–6, 14–15). But instead he chose to align with an earthly monarch, to embrace the national mood of pride and security, and to assert his authority against God's messenger.

He would spare Amaziah no longer.


So the Lord quietly withdrew the plumb line.

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¹The Lord God showed me this: a basket of summer fruit. ² He asked me, "What do you see, Amos?" I replied, "A basket of summer fruit." The Lord said to me, "The end has come for my people Israel; I will no longer spare them. ³ In that day the temple songs will become wailing"—this is the Lord God's declaration. "Many dead bodies, thrown everywhere! Silence!" ⁴ Hear this, you who trample on the needy and do away with the poor of the land,

⁵ asking, "When will the New Moon be over so we may sell grain, and the Sabbath, so we may market wheat? We can reduce the measure while increasing the price and cheat with dishonest scales. ⁶ We can buy the poor with silver and the needy for a pair of sandals and even sell the chaff!"

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Businesses exist to make profit, and scripture never calls that bad. Never. The problem is that these people have no moral guardrails in pursuit of money. People to them are not God's image-bearers. People are merely impediments to profit or steppingstones to success.


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A 2021 study from the University of Hong Kong analyzed 131 companies that had been convicted of financial fraud. Researchers compared the firms' CSR ["Corporate Social Responsibility"] scores

during the period when they were committing fraud with the period before they committed the fraud. They also compared the scores with those of similar companies in the same industry.



The companies' CSR scores were higher on average during the period when fraud was committed than during the period before the fraud, and when compared with similar industries. While high CSR scores are supposed to indicate ethical companies, the reverse seemed to be true...In 2019 the Business Roundtable released a statement redefining the purpose of a business to include value for a broad set of stakeholders. Two academics from the



London School of Economics and Columbia Business School [Aneesh Raghunandan and Shiva Rajgopal] published findings showing that the companies that signed the statement were 16 percentage points more likely to have a federal compliance violation than nonmember firms.

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

That is neither good nor bad. Yet it is <u>very</u> bad if we base our happiness and well-being on any economic system.

⁷ The Lord has sworn by the Pride of Jacob: I will never forget all their deeds. ⁸ Because of this, won't the land quake and all who dwell in it mourn? All of it will rise like the Nile; it will surge and then subside like the Nile in Egypt. ⁹ And in that day this is the declaration of the Lord God— I will make the sun go down at noon; I will darken the land in the daytime.

¹⁰ I will turn your feasts into mourning and all your songs into lamentation; I will cause everyone to wear sackcloth and every head to be shaved. I will make that grief like mourning for an only son and its outcome like a bitter day. ¹¹ Look, the days are coming this is the declaration of the Lord God when I will send a famine through the land: not a famine of bread or a thirst for water, but of hearing the words of the Lord.

¹² People will stagger from sea to sea and roam from north to east seeking the word of the Lord, but they will not find it. ¹³ In that day the beautiful young women, the young men also, will faint from thirst. ¹⁴ Those who swear by the guilt of Samaria and say, "As your god lives, Dan," or, "As the way of Beer-sheba lives" they will fall, never to rise again.
