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



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

- **Rapacious loans (8)**
- **Violating those who vow (12)**
- **Silencing God's word (12)**

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

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

Go carouse and be as wicked as possible. That's what many of the nations around Israel did, and chapters 1-2 pronounced their just punishment.





Go the other way and follow the fish sign. One of the earliest symbols for Christianity was the fish and notice that the fish here make a cross. Follow the self-sacrificial way of God.



There's a third possibility: to stay right where we are at the meat stall, boxed in by matters of daily sustenance, not picking a pious life but at least avoiding an exceptionally dissolute one. And this is tempting – Aertsen's naturalism is so staggering...that our eyes are drawn here first and are content to linger. 
