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





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Ephesians 4 CSB

Greek: περιπατέω peripateo = physically, to walk; as figure of speech

Originally – to tread down, a negative term for conquering ["walk all over someone"]

περιπατέω peripateo

The Christian is to walk: in newness of life, Rom 6:4 after the Spirit, Rom 8:4 in honesty, Rom 13:13 by faith, 2 Cor 5:7 in good works, Eph 2:10 in love, Eph 5:2 in wisdom, Col 4:5 in truth, 2 John 4 after the commandments of the Lord, 2 John 6



περιπατέω peripateo

The Christian is to walk:
not after the flesh, Rom 8:4
not after the manner of men, 1 Cor 3:3
not in craftiness, 2 Cor 4:2
not by sight [materialist input alone], 2 Cor 5:7

not in the vanity of the mind, Eph 4:17 not disorderly, 2 Thess 3:6

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

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
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




Most of the great movements in 20th c. Christianity were individualized. As a result, our 21st c. engagement with each other in one Father is minimized to the point where

commitment & unity are almost non-existent. There is very little loyalty and family dedication, that having been replaced with a consumer mindset.



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
Greek: πραΰτης prautes = from a word for "friendly," developed into a way to describe an amiable, even temperament

[This] is the quiet and friendly composure which does not become embittered or angry at what is unpleasant, whether in the form of people or fate. It is an active attitude and deliberate acceptance, not just a passive submission. – Epictetus, *Enchiridion*
