

He reigned six years in Tirzah, ²⁴ then he bought the hill of Samaria from Shemer for 150 pounds of silver, and he built up the hill. He named the city he built Samaria based on the name Shemer, the owner of the hill.

- The artistry is Phoenician, the highest form of 10th-8th c. B.C. sculpture.
- The woman depicted is watching over all the citizens & slaves. These signs were everywhere around the city. [Think Big Brother from 1984.]
- The woman appears Egyptian. Experts agree that is a device a stylistic choice that represents religious oversight. The most famous Egyptian religion in Israel was Baal worship; thus, the woman represents Baal's consort/sister Asherah who oversaw his cult.



²⁹ Ahab son of Omri became king over Israel in the thirty-eighth year of Judah's King Asa; Ahab son of Omri reigned over Israel in Samaria twenty-two years. ³⁰ But Ahab son of Omri did what was evil in the Lord's sight more than all who were before him. 31 Then, as if following the sin of Jeroboam son of Nebat were not enough, he married Jezebel, the daughter of Ethbaal king of the Sidonians, and then proceeded to serve Baal and bow in worship to him. 32 He set up an altar for Baal in the temple of Baal that he had built in Samaria. ³³ Ahab also made an Asherah pole. Ahab did more to anger the Lord God of Israel than all the kings of Israel who were before him. 1 Kings 16 CSB

- Elijah showed God's power to command the weather. 1K 17, 18
- Elijah multiplied food for a starving widow and her son when she was willing to share her portion. 1 Kings 17

- Jesus rebuked religious leaders for misleading the people and having an outward righteousness while their hearts were far from God. Matthew 23
- Jesus controlled the weather.

- Jesus multiplied food for crowds when a boy was willing to share his portion. John 6

- Jesus departed Sanhedrin's control for wilderness. John 11


Advent principle: Jesus is over, through, and in the best & worst of times. In order to fulfill the Triune God's Messianic plan, He spoke truth and endured isolation like Elijah – though His hardship was beyond anything the prophet could have imagined. This first advent candle is lit to celebrate the God over all times.

Gilead was a place of solitude and outdoor life. It was never a place of polish, sophistication, and diplomacy. It was an austere land, and one senses that Elijah's appearance was in keeping with that. [Such] characters may not win many friends, but one thing is certain: They cannot be ignored.





Baal – the god whom Ahab & Jezebel worship – is dead. He left behind no written truths.

Baal is symbolically pieced together and "resurrected" as a kind of zombie.

YHWH is immutably, fully alive. Thus, Elijah knows that YHWH speaks with power in His written truths. He knows that one acts differently when the Author is alive.


