NT mysteries


- Matt. 13:11 *The secrets of the kingdom of heaven* are explained by Jesus.

- 2 Thess. 2:7 The mystery of lawlessness further develops OT prophecy that a time of even greater evil will come in the future.



- After Alexander, they moved the city to a location between the hills, a site destined to long-term failure as the Cayster River mouth silted over, finally beyond repair.

- They sided with the Persians against the Greeks.
- Ephesus supported Sparta in the Peloponnesian Wars, but without Athens no one was strong enough to protect them from Persia again.
- Later, Ephesus turned against Sparta and backed the Persian resurgence.
- After Alexander, they moved the city to a long-term failure spot.
- Later, the Ephesians even joined Mithridates of Pontus in a revolt against Rome, brutally rioting and killing Roman citizens hiding in the Temple of Artemis. Rome didn't like that and expressed its displeasure harshly.





Huntington Hartford II grew up in the epitome of wealth. He was spoiled from a young age by servants paid to cater to him and was given presents every time his heart desired one. He inherited his fortune at the young age of 11, upon his father's death. The \$90 million was a result of being heir to the vast A&P empire that included grocery store chains across the country.

Hartford was extremely well-educated but was not very savvy when it came to managing his finances. He sunk his inheritance into a number of passion projects, including a modeling agency that turned into a money pit and a real estate deal in the Bahamas that resulted in a loss exceeding \$30 million. But the hemorrhaging of money did not end with investments. He was married and divorced four times, each settlement costing him more than the last. By 1992, he had to file for bankruptcy and was residing in a rundown Brooklyn rental. – Melissa Ferreura, "They Blew It All Away"

Notice again the repeated "in Him." Under Jesus – the sum of all things – we are blessed. This passage Ephesians 1 is one that I pray almost every morning to give thanks to God and to remind myself what He has done for me (us) "in Christ." Every good blessing we have is because we are "in Him." Thus, it's not about us, it's about who we are "in Christ" bringing glory to God.



"Sealed" means something that is protected by the governing authority. A seal indicates security, authenticity, and ownership.




