


A man lies and dreams of green fields and rivers,\*


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
When a Christian dies, a physician can determine medically that he is dead, but from a theological standpoint a person dies when the soul leaves the body. In 2 Corinthians 5:8, Paul speaks of being absent from the body and present with the Lord. When a believer in Christ dies, his soul doesn't stay in the body. We bury the body, but we don't bury the soul! The soul goes *immediately* into the presence of the Lord. – John Walvoord, "Fastening Your Grip on the Blessed Hope"

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


It is evident from the fact that Paul used the definite article *the* last trump that he expected the Corinthians [and Thessalonians]...to know what he was talking about...John has not written Revelation, [so] the only knowledge they would have of trumpets are those spoken of in the Old Testament [where] the last trump refers to the Feast of Trumpets. During the ceremony there are a series of short trumpet sounds concluding with one long trumpet blast called the *tekiah gedolah*, the great trumpet blast. Paul's point is that the

Rapture will be the fulfillment of the Feast of Trumpets.

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





The man in charge of the Temple mount would go around to every watch post carrying lighted torches before him. When he found a watchman which was not standing at his post he would say, "Shalom Aleichem (Peace be with you.)" If the man was slow to respond because he'd been sleeping, the captain struck him with his staff like a thief in the night. The captain also had the right to light the guard's garment on fire. Rabbi Eliezer ben Yaakov says, "One time they found my mother's brother sleeping and burned his garment." (m. *Middot* 1:2)



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


