





John's [authorship] was accepted by most of the important fathers such as Justin Martyr, Irenaeus, Tertullian, Hippolytus, Clement of Alexandria, and Origen. Practically all scholars today who accept the divine inspiration of the Book of Revelation also accept John the Apostle as its author. However, Erasmus, Luther, and Zwingli questioned the



Johannine authorship because it [the Revelation] teaches a literal 1,000-year reign of Christ. – John Walvoord, *Revelation*


On the monthly day, if he likes, each puts in a small donation; but only if it be his pleasure, and only if he be able: for there is no compulsion; all is voluntary. #### Some errors when interpreting *Revelation*:

- Deciding that Revelation is too divisive and thus not worthy of study.
- Declaring that Revelation is the most important thing to study.
- Abandoning the method of interpretation the Bible itself exposes [grammatical-historical-literary-platial] in favor of allegorical, mythological or historical-only interpretation.
- Divorcing Revelation from the Old & New Testament context.
- Refusing to let scripture interpret scripture when looking at symbols.
- Ignoring the "already/not yet" aspect of God's plan as revealed in the gospels & epistles.
- Forgetting prophetic reference where a prophecy is "fulfilled" in an illustrative manner that does not supplant the coming literal fulfillment.



Look at it, in its simplicity. "Meta tauta" signifies after the time of the churches. Beginning at the fourth chapter of the book of the Revelation, John discloses what God is going to do in His judgment upon Jew & Gentile after the church has completed its history, after Christ comes for His sainted



people...The next time we meet the church is in the nineteenth chapter of the book at the Marriage Supper of the Lamb. – W.A. Criswell, *Expository Sermons on Revelation*



#### **Biblical presentations of the throne of God:**

style 1 – place of God's rule and holiness. Is 6; Job 1.
style 2 – promised millennial reign of Messiah. 2 Sam 7; Zech 14; Is 11, Rev 20:1-10.
style 3 – throne of unlimited grace approachable through faith in Messiah Jesus. Heb 4.
style 4 – throne of manifested judgment. Ps 9; Dan 7; Rev 4-20.
style 5 – place of intimate, unmeasured comfort. Rev 21-22.



In heaven he saw a great throne with One sitting on it who had the appearance of jasper and carnelian. This jasper (cf. 21:18) is a clear stone in contrast to the opaque jasper stones known today; it may have resembled a diamond. The carnelian, also known as ruby or sardius, was a ruby-red color. The jasper and the carnelian were the first and last of the 12 gemstones worn on the high priest's breast (cf. Ex. 28:17-21). Jasper and sardius will be in the foundation of the New Jerusalem (Rev. 21:19–20). The throne's overall appearance was one of great beauty and color, enhanced by a rainbow, resembling an emerald, which encircled the throne. - John Walvoord, Revelation




