ἄγιος hagios = holy ones

- 1. hagios originally a term for holding someone/thing in awe.
- 2. The Athenian dramatists used hagios for something made clean.
- 3. Then, hagios was used to describe pulling away (like from heat).
- 4. That third sense never appears in scripture. In the Bible, hagios is used of something/one made clean & or held in awe, never something separate to shrink away from.
