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The heavenly Christ did not selfishly exploit His divine form and mode of being...but by His own decision emptied Himself of it or laid it by, taking the form of a servant by becoming man. The subject of ἐκένωσεν [the form of keno in verse 7] is not the incarnate but the pre-existent Lord. There is a strong sense of the unity of His person. The essence remains, the mode of being changes—a genuine sacrifice. – Albrecht Oepke, "κενόω" ²⁸ The crowds were astonished at his teaching, ²⁹ because he was teaching them like one who had authority, and not like their scribes. Loving the difficult [people] is only possible if it begins with the love God has shown us. Or to put it more simply, if you have an attitude problem, it's because you have a gratitude problem. Having lost sight of God's mercy, your heart is deficient in


