

Bible Study Guide: Seeing with Compassion – A Heart Transformed by Christ

 Source Transcript:

Big Idea

A heart transformed by Christ sees people differently—moving from judgment and division to compassion, love, and action.

Theme

Lent reshapes our hearts so we begin to see others—not as enemies or strangers—but as people in need of love, just as Christ sees us.

Core Scripture

Luke 10:33

“But a Samaritan, as he traveled, came where the man was; and when he saw him, he took pity on him.”

Introduction: A Radical Kind of Love

The story of the Good Samaritan:

- Breaks cultural barriers
- Redefines love
- Challenges the heart

Key Insight:

“Transformation in Christ changes how you see people.”

Cultural Context

- Jews and Samaritans were enemies
- Hatred and division ran deep

Yet:

- Compassion overrides conflict

Main Point 1: We Naturally See Through Division

Explanation

Human tendency:

- Categorize people
- Create “us vs. them”

Spiritual Truth

Without transformation:

- We see enemies
- We justify distance

“We often see barriers before we see people.”

Application

- Who do I struggle to love?
- Where do I create divisions?

Sticky Quote:

“Division is natural—compassion is supernatural.”

Main Point 2: Compassion Begins with Seeing

Explanation

The Samaritan:

- Notices the wounded man
- Stops to look

“When he saw him, he took pity.”

Spiritual Truth

Transformation starts when:

- We truly see others

Application

- Am I paying attention to people's needs?
- Or rushing past them?

Sticky Quote:

“You cannot love what you refuse to see.”

Main Point 3: A Transformed Heart Feels Differently

Explanation

The Samaritan:

- Feels compassion
- Is moved emotionally

Spiritual Truth

God changes:

- Our perspective
- Our emotions

“A changed heart responds differently.”

Application

- What hardens my heart?
- Where do I need compassion?

Sticky Quote:

“God softens what sin hardens.”

Main Point 4: Compassion Leads to Action

Explanation

The Samaritan:

- Doesn't just feel
- He acts

Spiritual Truth

True compassion:

- Is active
- Not passive

“Compassion always moves us to act.”

Application

- How am I responding to others' needs?
- Am I acting or ignoring?

Sticky Quote:

“Love is proven by action.”

Main Point 5: Love Crosses Barriers

Explanation

The Samaritan:

- Helps someone considered an enemy

Spiritual Truth

God's love:

- Crosses boundaries
- Breaks division

“Christ sees no enemies—only people to love.”

Application

- What barriers keep me from loving others?
- How can I overcome them?

Sticky Quote:

“Love goes where comfort won't.”

Main Point 6: Lent Changes How We See Others

Explanation

Lent:

- Refocuses our hearts
- Aligns us with Christ

“Lent transforms how we see the world.”

Spiritual Truth

As we grow:

- Our vision changes
- Our priorities shift

Application

- How has my perspective changed?
- What is God teaching me?

Sticky Quote:

“A transformed heart sees differently.”

Main Point 7: We Are Called to Reflect Christ’s Love

Explanation

Jesus:

- Sees our brokenness
- Responds with love

Spiritual Truth

We are called to:

- Do the same

“He saw your heart and responded.”

Application

- How can I reflect Christ's love?
- Who needs it from me?

Sticky Quote:

“Love others the way Christ loves you.”

Main Point 8: Compassion Requires Sacrifice

Explanation

Helping others:

- Costs time
- Costs energy
- Costs comfort

Spiritual Truth

True love:

- Requires sacrifice

Application

- What am I willing to give?
- What is holding me back?

Sticky Quote:

“Compassion costs—but it changes lives.”

Main Point 9: Obstacles to Compassion Must Be Removed

Explanation

Barriers include:

- Busyness
- Fear
- Judgment

“Many things stop us from loving others.”

Spiritual Truth

We must:

- Remove distractions
- Focus on people

Application

- What is preventing me from loving others?
- What do I need to let go?

Sticky Quote:

“Remove what blocks your love.”

Main Point 10: Love Is the Mark of Transformation

Explanation

When we change:

- Our love grows
- Our actions reflect Christ

Spiritual Truth

Transformation shows in:

- Relationships
- Compassion
- Service

“You will see people differently.”

Application

- How is my love growing?
- What evidence of transformation is in my life?

Sticky Quote:

“Transformation is seen in how you love.”

1. Notice People
