

Bible Study Guide: One in Christ

Scripture: Galatians 3:28

"There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." (ESV)

Theme

Christ unites all believers.

Study Objective

To understand that through faith in Jesus Christ, all believers are united as one family of God. While our backgrounds and roles may differ, our identity, value, and standing before God are equal in Christ.

Background

Paul wrote to the Galatian churches to correct the false teaching that some believers were more accepted by God than others based on keeping the Jewish law. In Galatians 3, he explains that salvation comes through faith in Christ alone. Because of this, every believer becomes a child of God and part of one spiritual family. Ethnic, social, and gender

distinctions do not determine a person's worth or access to God's promises. In Christ, all believers share the same grace, salvation, and inheritance.

Key Truth

Faith in Jesus Christ unites believers into one family where every person has equal value and equal access to God's grace.

Cross References

Ephesians 2:14–16

Jesus is our peace, breaking down the dividing wall of hostility and creating one new people in Himself.

Truth: Christ removes barriers that separate people.

Colossians 3:11

"Here there is not Greek and Jew... but Christ is all, and in all."

Truth: Our identity in Christ is greater than earthly distinctions.

1 Corinthians 12:12–13

Believers are baptized by one Spirit into one body.

Truth: The church is one body with many members.

John 17:20–23

Jesus prayed that His followers would be one, just as He and the Father are one.

Romans 10:12–13

There is no distinction between Jew and Gentile, for the same Lord is Lord of all.

Observation Questions

1. What three groups does Paul mention in this verse?
 2. What does Paul say about believers in Christ?
 3. What phrase is repeated that emphasizes unity?
 4. What does "one in Christ Jesus" mean?
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Interpretation

Paul is not saying that cultural backgrounds, social roles, or gender no longer exist. Rather, he teaches that these differences do not affect a believer's standing before God. Every person who trusts in

Christ receives the same salvation, becomes a child of God, and shares equally in His promises. The church is called to reflect this unity by showing love, acceptance, humility, and mutual respect.

Application

Ask yourself:

- Do I treat other believers as equal members of God's family?
- Are there prejudices or divisions I need to surrender to God?
- How can I promote unity within my church and community?
- Does my life reflect Christ's love toward people who are different from me?

Practical applications:

- Value every believer as a member of God's family.
- Build friendships across cultural, social, and generational differences.
- Reject attitudes of favoritism, prejudice, or discrimination.
- Work toward peace and unity within the church.

- Celebrate the diversity of gifts and backgrounds that strengthen the body of Christ.

1. What does it mean to be "one in Christ"?
 2. How does the gospel overcome divisions between people?
 3. Why is unity important in the church?
 4. How can believers maintain unity while appreciating diversity?
 5. What practical steps can your church take to demonstrate the unity found in Christ?
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Key Lessons

- All believers are equal before God through faith in Jesus Christ.
- Christ unites people from every background into one family.
- Salvation is based on faith, not ethnicity, status, or gender.
- Unity in Christ reflects God's love to the world.
- Christians are called to live in love, humility, and mutual respect.

Memory Verse

Galatians 3:28

"There is neither Jew nor Greek... for you are all one in Christ Jesus."
