

Bible Study Guide: Philippians 2:13

Theme: God Works Within Us

Key Scripture

"For it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose." — Philippians 2:13 (NIV)

Theme

God Works Within Us

Short Explanation

God does not simply tell us what to do and then leave us on our own. Through the Holy Spirit, He gives us both the desire to follow Him and the strength to obey Him. As believers, we are not trying to live the Christian life through our own power. God is actively at work within us, shaping our hearts, renewing our minds, and empowering us to fulfill His purposes.

Introduction

Many people feel inadequate when it comes to living the Christian life. We know what God desires, but often struggle to find the motivation or strength to follow through. Philippians 2:13 reminds us that God is not a

distant observer. He is actively working within His people.

Paul writes these words in the context of encouraging believers to live humbly and obediently, following the example of Christ. The good news is that God supplies what He commands. He works in us so that His purposes can be accomplished through us.

Point 1: God Initiates the Work

Scripture

Philippians 1:6

"He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."

Study

The Christian journey begins with God. Salvation is not something we earn; it is God's gift. Just as He begins the work of faith in us, He continues to develop and mature us.

God saw potential in Moses when Moses saw excuses.
God saw a king in David when others saw a shepherd boy.

God saw an apostle in Paul when others saw a persecutor.

Discussion Questions

1. How have you seen God working in your life over time?
2. What areas of growth can you identify since becoming a believer?

Application

Take time this week to reflect on how God has already transformed you and thank Him for His ongoing work.

Point 2: God Changes Our Desires

Scripture

Psalm 37:4

"Take delight in the Lord, and he will give you the desires of your heart."

Study

Philippians 2:13 says God works in us "to will." This means He shapes our desires. Before Christ, our desires often centered on ourselves. As we grow in faith, God begins to align our hearts with His.

The Holy Spirit transforms what we love, what we pursue, and what motivates us.

Biblical Example

Zacchaeus desired wealth and status. After encountering Jesus, his desires changed, and he willingly gave generously to others.

Discussion Questions

1. What desires has God changed in your life?
2. Are there desires you need to surrender to Him?

Application

Pray daily, "Lord, help me desire what You desire."

Point 3: God Provides the Strength

Scripture

Philippians 4:13

"I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me."

Study

Not only does God change our desires, but He also gives us the ability to act. Obedience is possible because God empowers us through His Spirit.

Many believers become discouraged because they try to rely solely on their own strength. God never intended us to live independently of Him.

Biblical Example

Peter denied Jesus out of fear. After receiving the Holy Spirit, he boldly preached Christ before thousands.

Discussion Questions

1. What areas of obedience feel difficult right now?
2. How can you rely more on God's strength than your own?

Application

Identify one challenge where you need God's help and pray specifically for His strength.

Point 4: God Works for His Purpose

Scripture

Romans 8:28

"And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose."

Study

God's work in us is not random. He is shaping us for His purposes and His glory. Every season, challenge, and opportunity can become part of God's plan to make us more like Christ.

Biblical Example

Joseph endured betrayal, slavery, and imprisonment, yet God used every circumstance to fulfill His greater purpose.

Discussion Questions

1. How might God be using your current circumstances for His purposes?
2. What gifts or talents has God given you to serve others?

Application

Look for one opportunity this week to serve someone using the gifts God has given you.

Point 5: Our Response Is Cooperation

Scripture

Philippians 2:12

"Continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling."

Study

While God does the inner work, we are called to cooperate with Him. Spiritual growth happens as we pray, study Scripture, worship, serve, and obey.

Think of a sailboat. The sailor cannot create the wind, but he can raise the sail. God provides the power; we position ourselves to receive it.

Biblical Example

Noah could not send the flood or save humanity on his own, but he faithfully obeyed God's instructions.

Discussion Questions

1. What spiritual habits help you stay connected to God?
2. Where is God calling you to take a step of obedience?

Application

Choose one spiritual discipline to focus on this week and commit to practicing it daily.
