#### **Overview of Proverbs 30**

Book of Proverbs Proverbs 30 contains the sayings of Agur, a man who speaks with deep humility about human weakness, the greatness of God, and the importance of wisdom. This chapter highlights themes of humility, contentment, self-control, reverence for God, and learning from creation itself.

Unlike many sections of Proverbs that emphasize confidence in wisdom, Proverbs 30 begins with an honest admission of human limitation. It reminds believers that true wisdom begins when people recognize their need for God and trust His truth above human understanding.

#### **Key Theme**

**True wisdom begins with humility before God, contentment in His provision, and reverence for His truth and authority.**

#### **Historical Context**

Proverbs 30 is attributed to Agur son of Jakeh (Proverbs 30:1), a figure not widely known elsewhere in Scripture. His sayings reflect the style of Hebrew wisdom literature, using observations from daily life and nature to teach spiritual truths.

The chapter repeatedly points to the greatness of God and the limitations of human understanding, emphasizing humility and dependence on God rather than pride or self-sufficiency.
