#### **Overview of Proverbs 31**

Proverbs 31 contains the sayings taught to King Lemuel by his mother (Proverbs 31:1). While little is known historically about Lemuel, the chapter reflects the importance of parental wisdom and godly instruction in leadership and daily living.

The final section describing the virtuous woman presents an ideal portrait of wisdom in action. In Hebrew culture, this was not merely about domestic life—it reflected strength, business wisdom, leadership, compassion, diligence, and spiritual faithfulness.

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## **Five Major Lessons from Proverbs 31**

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### **1. Godly Leadership Requires Wisdom and Self-Control**

#### **Key Scripture**

“It is not for kings, O Lemuel, it is not for kings to drink wine...” — Proverbs 31:4

#### **Explanation**

Leaders must exercise discipline and wisdom because their decisions affect others. Proverbs warns against

anything that clouds judgment, weakens discernment, or leads to careless leadership.

This principle applies to pastors, parents, business leaders, teachers, and anyone entrusted with influence.
