

Bible Study Guide: Peace and Mercy

Scripture: Galatians 6:16

"And as for all who walk by this rule, peace and mercy be upon them, and upon the Israel of God."
(ESV)

Theme

God's peace belongs to those who faithfully follow Christ.

Study Objective

To understand that God's peace and mercy are promised to those who live according to the truth of the gospel. As believers trust in Christ and walk in obedience to His Word, they experience the assurance of God's presence, grace, and care.

Background

Paul concludes his letter to the Galatians by emphasizing that what truly matters is not outward religious rituals but becoming a new creation in Christ (Galatians 6:15). He then pronounces a blessing of peace and mercy upon those who "walk

by this rule"—those who place their faith in Christ alone and live according to the gospel. Rather than depending on human effort or legalistic practices, believers are called to trust God's grace and faithfully follow Jesus.

Key Truth

Those who trust in Christ and live according to the gospel experience God's peace, mercy, and the blessings of His grace.

Cross References

Philippians 4:6–7

"And the peace of God... will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Truth: God's peace protects believers who trust Him.

John 14:27

Jesus gives His followers a peace unlike anything the world can offer.

Romans 5:1

"Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ."

Truth: Peace with God comes through faith in Christ.

Lamentations 3:22–23

God's mercies are new every morning because of His great faithfulness.

Ephesians 2:8–9

Salvation is by grace through faith, not by works.

Observation Questions

1. Who receives Paul's blessing of peace and mercy?
 2. What does Paul mean by "walk by this rule"?
 3. What two blessings does Paul mention?
 4. How does this verse connect with the message of Galatians?
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Interpretation

The "rule" Paul refers to is the truth of the gospel—that salvation comes through faith in Jesus Christ and that believers are made new by God's grace, not by keeping the law. Those who order their lives according to this truth experience God's peace, which comes from being reconciled to Him, and His mercy, which is His continual compassion and forgiveness. Walking by this rule means living in faith, obedience, humility, and dependence on Christ each day.

Application

Ask yourself:

- Am I trusting in Christ alone for my peace with God?
- Do I rely on God's mercy each day?
- Is my life guided by the truth of the gospel?
- How can I share God's peace and mercy with others?

Practical applications:

- Spend time daily in prayer and God's Word to strengthen your walk with Christ.
- Rest in God's peace instead of giving in to fear or worry.

- Show mercy and forgiveness to others as God has shown mercy to you.
 - Live with gratitude for the grace you have received through Jesus.
 - Encourage others to trust in the gospel and experience God's peace.
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Discussion Questions

1. What does it mean to "walk by this rule"?
 2. How is God's peace different from the peace the world offers?
 3. Why is God's mercy essential in the Christian life?
 4. How does the gospel give believers lasting peace?
 5. In what ways can we demonstrate God's peace and mercy to those around us?
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Key Lessons

- God's peace comes through faith in Jesus Christ.
- God's mercy is a continual expression of His love and grace.

- Believers are called to live according to the truth of the gospel.
 - Faithful obedience flows from God's grace, not from legalism.
 - Walking with Christ brings assurance, hope, and spiritual peace.
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Memory Verse

Galatians 6:16

"And as for all who walk by this rule, peace and mercy be upon them..."

Prayer
