

Bible Study Guide: Clothed with Christ

Scripture: Galatians 3:27

"For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ." (ESV)

Theme

Our new identity is found in Christ.

Study Objective

To understand that through faith in Jesus Christ, believers receive a new identity. Being "clothed with Christ" means we belong to Him, share in His righteousness, and are called to live in a way that reflects His character.

Background

In Galatians 3, Paul teaches that all who believe in Christ are God's children through faith. He explains that believers are no longer defined by the divisions of the world or by the requirements of the Law. Baptism symbolizes our union with Christ, publicly declaring that our old life has been left behind and that we now live as new creations in Him. Paul

emphasizes that our identity is rooted in Christ alone.

Key Truth

When we place our faith in Jesus Christ, we are given a new identity. We are united with Christ and called to reflect His character in every area of our lives.

Cross References

Romans 6:3–4

Believers are united with Christ in His death and resurrection, symbolized through baptism.

Truth: Baptism identifies us with Christ's saving work.

2 Corinthians 5:17

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation."

Truth: Faith in Christ brings a completely new life.

Colossians 3:9–10

Believers are to put off the old self and put on the new self, which is being renewed in Christ.

Ephesians 4:22–24

Christians are called to leave behind their old way of life and put on the new self created in righteousness and holiness.

Romans 13:14

"Put on the Lord Jesus Christ..."

Truth: Our daily lives should reflect the character of Christ.

Observation Questions

1. What does Paul say believers have "put on"?
 2. What role does baptism play in this verse?
 3. What does the phrase "clothed with Christ" suggest?
 4. How does this verse describe the believer's relationship with Jesus?
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Interpretation

To be "clothed with Christ" means that believers are united with Him through faith and are identified with His life, righteousness, and purpose. Just as clothing is visible to others, our relationship with Christ should be evident in our attitudes, words, and actions. Baptism is the outward expression of this inward reality, symbolizing our new life in Christ. Our identity is no longer based on our past, our achievements, or our failures, but on who we are in Him.

Application

Ask yourself:

- Is my identity rooted in Christ or in the opinions of others?
- Does my daily life reflect the character of Jesus?
- Am I living as someone who belongs to Christ?
- How can I demonstrate my new identity through my actions?

Practical applications:

- Remember each day that your worth comes from being in Christ.
- Choose attitudes and behaviors that reflect Jesus' love and holiness.

- Leave behind habits that belong to your old life.
 - Live with confidence, knowing you are God's child.
 - Let your words and actions point others to Christ.

1. What does it mean to be "clothed with Christ"?
 2. How does our identity in Christ differ from worldly identities?
 3. Why is baptism an important symbol for believers?
 4. What changes should be evident in someone who has put on Christ?
 5. How can you reflect Christ more clearly in your daily life?
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Key Lessons

- Believers receive a new identity through faith in Christ.
- Baptism is an outward sign of an inward transformation.
- Our old life has been replaced with a new life in Christ.

- Christians are called to reflect Christ's character.
 - Our value and identity are found in Jesus, not in worldly standards.

Galatians 3:27

"For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ."
