## TEXT: Hebrews 3:7-11

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- <sup>7</sup> Therefore, as the Holy Spirit says,
  - “Today, if you hear his voice,  
<sup>8</sup> do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion,  
on the day of testing in the wilderness,  
<sup>9</sup> where your fathers put me to the test

and saw my works for forty years.

<sup>10</sup> Therefore I was provoked with that generation,  
and said, “They always go astray in their heart;

they have not known my ways.”

<sup>11</sup> As I swore in my wrath,  
“They shall not enter my rest.””

## TEXT: Hebrews 3:12-15

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- <sup>12</sup> Take care, brothers, lest there be in any of you an evil, unbelieving heart, leading you to fall away from the living God. <sup>13</sup> But exhort one another every day, as long as it is called “today,” that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. <sup>14</sup> For we have come to share in Christ, if indeed we hold our original confidence firm to the end. <sup>15</sup> As it is said,
  - “Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion.”

## TEXT: Hebrews 3:16-19

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- <sup>16</sup> For who were those who heard and yet rebelled? Was it not all those who left Egypt led by Moses? <sup>17</sup> And with whom was he provoked for forty years? Was it not with those who sinned, whose bodies fell in the wilderness? <sup>18</sup> And to whom did he swear that they would not enter his rest, but to those who were disobedient? <sup>19</sup> So we see that they were unable to enter because of unbelief.

## TEXT: Hebrews 4:1-2

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- 4 Therefore, since a promise remains of entering His rest, let us fear lest any of you seem to have come short of it. <sup>2</sup> For indeed the gospel was preached to us as well as to them; but the word which they heard did not profit them, not being mixed with faith in those who heard *it*.

## 2 Cor 5:7

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- <sup>7</sup> For we walk by faith, not by sight.

## Rom 8:24

- <sup>24</sup> For we were saved in this hope, but hope that is seen is not hope; for why does one still hope for what he sees?

## Hebrews 11:1-3

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- **11** Now faith is the substance of the word of God, so that the things hoped for, the things which are seen were not the evidence of things not made of things which are visible. seen. <sup>2</sup> For by it the elders obtained a *good* testimony.
- <sup>3</sup> By faith we understand that the worlds were framed by

## Hebrews 2:14 - 16

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- <sup>14</sup> Inasmuch then as the children have partaken of flesh and blood, He Himself likewise shared in the same, that through death He might destroy him who had the power of death, that is, the devil, <sup>15</sup> and release those who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage. <sup>16</sup> For indeed He does not give aid to angels, but He does give aid to the seed of Abraham.

## CONCLUSION - Rev 18:7

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- <sup>7</sup> In the measure that she glorified herself and lived luxuriously, in the same measure give her torment and sorrow; for she says in her heart, 'I sit *as* queen, and am no widow, and will not see sorrow.'

## CONCLUSION - Hebrews 4:9-11

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- <sup>9</sup> There remains therefore a rest for the people of God. <sup>10</sup> For he who has entered His rest has himself also ceased from his works as God *did* from His.
- <sup>11</sup> Let us therefore be diligent to enter that rest, lest anyone fall according to the same example of disobedience.

## CONCLUSION – Mark 1:16-20

- <sup>16</sup> And as He walked by the Sea of Galilee, He saw Simon and Andrew his brother casting a net into the sea; for they were fishermen. <sup>17</sup> Then Jesus said to them, “Follow Me, and I will make you become fishers of men.” <sup>18</sup> They immediately left their nets and followed Him.
- <sup>19</sup> When He had gone a little farther from there, He saw James the *son* of Zebedee, and John his brother, who also *were* in the boat mending their nets. <sup>20</sup> And immediately He called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired servants, and went after Him.
