## Mark 14:3–10 – Study & Discussion Questions

### 1. Observation (What does the text say?)

- What stands out to you most about the woman's actions?
- What specifically made her offering "costly"?
- How did others respond to her act of worship?
- What reasons did they give for criticizing her?
- What does Judas do immediately after this event?

### 2. Understanding (What does it mean?)

- Why do you think Jesus called her act a "good" or "beautiful" work?
- What does "she has done what she could" (v. 8) reveal about how God sees our obedience?
- Why do you think Mark places the woman's worship right next to Judas' betrayal?
- What does this passage teach us about how differently people can respond to Jesus—even in the same environment?

### 3. Heart Check (Personal Reflection)

- What do I value most right now—Jesus or something else?
- Is there anything in my life I am holding back from God?
- Have I ever felt hesitant to fully express my love for Jesus because of what others might think?
- Do I tend to criticize or question things I don't fully understand spiritually?

### 4. Application (Living it out)

- What would it look like for me to "break the flask" in my current season?
- Time?
- Finances?
- Obedience?
- Sharing my faith?
- What is one practical way I can show extravagant love to Jesus this week?
- How can I grow in spiritual sensitivity like the woman did?



## **5. Contrast Reflection (Woman vs. Judas)**

- In what subtle ways can I drift toward a “Judas mindset” (self-interest, control, valuing other things more than Jesus)?
- What habits or decisions help me stay in a place of wholehearted devotion like the woman?

## **6. Eternal Perspective**

- Jesus said her act would be remembered wherever the gospel is preached—what does that tell you about what God values?
- How does this passage reshape how you view “success” in God’s eyes?

## **Closing Response**

- What is the Holy Spirit prompting me to do in response to this message—and will I say yes?
