

### From Your Parish Nurses... Macular Degeneration

Age-related macular degeneration (AMD) is an eye disease that is caused by damage to the macula in your retina. The macula is responsible for your central vision. AMD is the leading cause of vision loss in adults 50 years and older.

AMD is broken into two categories: wet and dry. Dry AMD is the most common. With Dry AMD, Drusens, yellow deposits made up of proteins, slowly develop. This causes central vision to be lost slowly. Wet AMD happens when abnormal blood vessels grow under the retina. The vessels end up leaking fluid which causes scarring of the macula. Central vision is lost much faster with wet AMD.

Risk factors for AMD include:

- Family history of AMD
- Smoking
- Caucasians

AMD is diagnosed by an ophthalmologist. The Amsler grid is often used to help make a diagnosis. That grid can also be used by patients at home to monitor the progression of their symptoms.

While there is no cure for either kind of AMD, there are various treatment options that can help manage progression. Those treatments can include injections, medications, supplements, and diet changes. Treatment will be guided by an ophthalmologist based on the type of AMD.
