Diana Appelbaum in her book *Thanksgiving: An American Holiday, An American History* makes an eye-opening comment about the way we tend to understand Thanksgiving: "If asked to list Thanksgiving traditions, many people would think of turkey, cranberries, and Pilgrims but omit grateful prayers and worship services — an ironic situation for a holiday conceived by pious people as an opportunity for prayer, but a true reflection of modern attitudes. Americans know far more about the ship on which the Pilgrims sailed, the food they ate and the clothes they wore, than about the way they worshiped."

It's true. A holiday originally set aside for devotion to God often becomes a devotion to food and football. We may be thankful for the good things in life, but we seldom let God know it. And so the most basic Thanksgiving tradition — expressing gratefulness to God — is often anything but traditional. Yet Thanksgiving is so much more meaningful when we thank God for our blessings, especially if we know his Son, Jesus Christ, as the Savior who died for our sins and then rose again from the dead.

We all have traditions that are important to us, and Thanksgiving is one of those times that heaps fond memories on those traditions. Take time to give God his rightful place in your Thanksgiving this year. And as you bask in your physical blessings, remember the words of the apostle Paul: "Command those who are rich in this present world not to be arrogant nor to put their hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to put their hope in God, who richly provides us with everything for our enjoyment" (1 Timothy 6:17).

Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth.

*Worship the Lord with gladness;
come before him with joyful songs.*

Know that the Lord is God.

*It is he who made us, and we are his;
we are his people, the sheep of his pasture.*

*Enter his gates with thanksgiving
and his courts with praise;*

give thanks to him and praise his name.

For the Lord is good and his love endures forever;

his faithfulness continues through all generations. (Psalm 100)

Catechism Review:

The Use of the Keys and Confession

In the Catechism, Martin Luther was striving to stress the essentials of Christianity. For him, these included the 10 commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, etc. I'm sure you can recall learning these basic truths during confirmation class. Among those truths were Luther's insights into what the Bible said about confession and absolution called the use of the keys and confession. When one considers what God's Word says about confession and absolution, you quickly realize that it's more than being forced to say, "I'm sorry." Nor is it about being sorry only because you got caught. Understanding confession and absolution correctly means that you understand how God works repentance in our hearts. From Your Parish Nurses... Prostate Health

There is plenty of strong evidence that good nutrition and an active lifestyle can reduce the likelihood of prostate cancer and slow its progression.

Beyond Cancer suggests to eat a diet that is high in colorful vegetables, low in sugar and processed carbohydrates, and moderate in animal-based protein (taking advantage of the health benefits of beans, nuts, soy, and certain fish)

Cruciferous vegetables are high in antioxidants, vitamins, minerals, and phytochemicals. Broccoli, often hailed as prostate super food. Berries are a great source, particularly strawberries, blackberries, blueberries, and raspberries.

Fish (especially cold-water fish like salmon, sardines, and trout) provide “good fats” that don’t trigger inflammation the same way as saturated animal fats.

Tomatoes are one food that’s been on prostate cancer researchers’ radar for a long time. Lycopene is another powerful antioxidant and is found in the cell walls of tomatoes.

Green tea is a source of antioxidants such as catechins (the most important are two called EGCG, for epigallocatechin-3-gallate, and epicatechin), which are believed to be anti-carcinogenic and anti-mutagenic. Some studies that suggest drinking coffee regularly, one to two cups a day, can help prevent prostate cancer.

Year-End Giving Reminders

If you elected to have **paper giving statements**, they will be distributed to church call boxes semi-annually (after June 30th and after December 31st).

Members who are taking a **Required Minimum Distribution (RMD)** from a retirement account can choose to have those funds sent directly to Christ. This would fulfill your requirement for a distribution and having it directly sent to Christ Lutheran will prevent the distribution from being taxable to you. Parents: When dropping off or picking up your children for Sunday School, please park your vehicle in the parking lot and walk with your children in and out of the church building. **Please do not park your vehicle anywhere in the circle drive in the upper level main entryway and canopy area of the church.** There are many elderly and handicapped members who have difficulty getting into the entryway to our church because of the number of vehicles in the circle. There is one section of the entryway where the curb is sloped for wheelchairs and walkers. There is one handicapped accessible door in the entryway. It is important that these areas are not blocked. This is also a designated fire lane and emergency vehicle area.

Reminder that by law our **handicapped parking spaces** are reserved for those who have a handicapped parking permit.
