How Well Do You REALLY Know the Bible?

People who don't believe in Christ often don't really know why they believe what they do believe. They may talk instead about how their belief makes them feel or how it makes their life-perspective real for them.

Christians have a core and foundation for what they believe, it's the message God himself has given us—his Word. Even though there is a mass of scientific, archaeological, and historical evidence that supports much of what is in the Bible and what it says, Christians don't need or rely on it. Their faith depends entirely on what God says in his Word.

Sadly, many Christians are nowhere near as knowledgeable about what Scripture says, even though they may think they are. Here are some examples of what the Bible does not say, followed by what the Bible actually says.

"Follow your heart"

Jeremiah 17:9 "The heart is deceitful above all things and beyond cure. Who can understand it?"

"Be true to yourself"

Luke 9:23, Then Jesus said to them all, "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me."

"Believe in yourself"

John 14:1,6, [Jesus told his disciples] "You believe in God; believe also in me ... I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

"Live your truth"

John 18:37, Jesus answered, "In fact, the reason I was born and came into the world is to testify to the truth. Everyone on the side of truth listens to me."

"As long as you're happy, that's all that matters"

Mark 8.36, [Jesus said] "What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul?"

God wants us to know exactly what he says. We have no excuse for being deceived. Just because something sounds wise doesn't mean it is. Don't be fooled. Read your Bible daily. Go to church regularly as God tells us in his commandments. Attend a Bible class. Send your children to Sunday School and Confirmation Class. Do this, and you'll find that the words God spoke to the prophet Daniel will come true for you, "Many will be purified, made spotless and refined, but the wicked will continue to be wicked. None of the wicked will understand, but those who are wise will understand" (Daniel 12:10).

ELDER'S MESSAGE

Yesterday, Today, and Forever

Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever for us. The writer of Hebrews, in chapter 13: verse 8 says "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever." What does this mean for us? "The same" refers to Christ's eternal divinity, He is unchangeable. His covenant of grace does not change. John states in John 1:1 "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." In verse 14 he also says "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth." Jesus was God and a person of the Trinity when he created the world. Read verses 17 & 18 also.

After Adam and Eve's fall into sin, in Genesis 3:15, the promise of a Savior is first given, God says to Satan: "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he shall crush your head, and you shall strike his heal." This promise of a Savior has not changed since it was first made when Adam and Eve fell into sin. This promise (supported by scripture) has not changed as other religions that have been created (not supported by scripture) come and go.

The same promise made to Adam and Eve was still there when David was king of Israel. In Psalm 31:1-5 David accepts God's will as death approaches. In verse 5 he says: "Into your hands I commit my spirit; deliver me, LORD, my faithful God." These first words in the verse were the same words of Jesus when he was dying on the cross.

When Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem with his disciples, Luke states in Luke 9:51; "As the time approached for him to be taken up to heaven, Jesus resolutely set out to Jerusalem." Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem to complete the promise that we read in Genesis 3:15. He lived a perfect life for us. He was crucified on the cross for us. He rose from the dead for us. Because he fulfilled this promise, we will not only die with Jesus but we will be raised up with him into everlasting righteousness.

Because, according to his eternal divinity he is unchangeable and his covenant of grace does not change (we are saved by grace alone, not by works, so that no one can boast), we have the assurance that we have the same promise as all followers of Christ that have come before us.

This should continue to give all of us comfort knowing that the promise of God is unchanging.

While I draw this fleeting breath, when my eyelids close in death When I soar to worlds unknown, see you on your judgment throne Rock of Ages, cleft for me, let me hide myself in thee.

From Your Parish Nurses... Osteoporosis

Osteoporosis or porous bone is a disease characterized by low bone mass and structural deterioration of bone tissue leading to bone fragility and increased risk of fractures. Men and women can be affected by this disease which can be treated and prevented. In the US 45 million either already have osteoporosis or are at high risk. It is often called the silent disease and is not detected until a fall and fracture.

Risk factors you cannot change:

- Gender: Women more than men
- Age: the older you are the higher the risk
- Body size: small thin women
- Ethnicity: Caucasian and Asian women highest risk
- Family history

Risks you can change:

- Alcohol intake
- Inactive lifestyle
- Calcium and vitamin D intake
- · Cigarette smoking
- Anorexia
- Low estrogen levels (menopause)

Detection:

- Have a comprehensive medical assessment by a physician
- Have a bone density test

Treatment:

- Good nutrition
- Exercise
- Medications if indicated by your physician
- Fall prevention
