







CONFESSION OF SINS AND FORGIVENESS

P: In the cleansing waters of baptism, we were marked with the sign of the cross.

RESPONSIVE PASSION HISTORY READING

Leader: Jesus told the disciples,

Men: "This very night you will all fall away on account of me, for it is written: **Women**: 'I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep of the flock will be scattered.'

Men: But after I have risen, I will go ahead of you into Galilee."

Leader: Peter replied,

Cong.: "Even if all fall away on account of you, I never will."

Men: "I tell you the truth, this very night, before the rooster crows twice, you will

disown me three times."

Leader: But Peter declared,

Cong.: "Even if I have to die with you, I will never disown you."

Leader: And all the other disciples said the same. Then Jesus went with his disciples to a

place called Gethsemane, and he said to them,

Men: "Sit here while I go over there and pray."

Leader: He took Peter and the two sons of Zebedee along with him, and he began to be

sorrowful and troubled. Then he said to them,

Men: "My soul is overwhelmed with sorrow to the point of death. Stay here and keep

watch with me."

Leader: Going a little farther, he fell with his face to the ground and prayed,

Cong.: "My Father, if it is possible, may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but

as you will."

Leader: An angel from heaven appeared to him and strengthened him. And being in an-

guish, he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat was like drops of blood falling to the ground. Then he returned to his disciples and found them sleeping. He

asked Peter,

Cong.: "Could you men not keep watch with me for one hour? Watch and pray so that

you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the body is weak."

Leader: He went away a second time and prayed,

Cong.: "My Father, if it is not possible for this cup to be taken away unless I drink it,

may your will be done."

Leader: When he came back, he again found them sleeping, because their eyes were

heavy. So he left them and went away once more and prayed the third time, say-

ing the same thing. Then he returned to the disciples and said to them,

Cong.: "Are you still sleeping and resting? Look, the hour is near, and the Son of Man is

betrayed into the hands of sinners. Rise, let us go. Here comes my betrayer!"

Leader: Now Judas, who betrayed him, knew the place, because Jesus had often met

there with his disciples. While he was still speaking, Judas, one of the Twelve, arrived. With him was a large crowd armed with swords and clubs, sent from the chief priests and the elders of the people. Now the betrayer had arranged a sig-

nal with them:

Men: "The one I kiss is the man; arrest him."

Leader: Going at once to Jesus, Judas said, "Greetings, Rabbi!" and kissed him. Jesus re-

plied,

Cong.: "Judas, are you betraying the Son of Man with a kiss? Friend, do what you came

for."

Leader: When Jesus' followers saw what was going to happen, they said,

Cong.: "Lord, should we strike with our swords?"

Leader: And Peter struck the servant of the high priest, cutting off his right ear. (The

servant's name was Malchus.) But Jesus answered,

Men: "No more of this!"

Women: And he touched the man's ear and healed him. Jesus said,

Leader: "Put your sword back in its place, for all who draw the sword will die by the

sword. Do you think I cannot call on my Father, and he will at once put at my disposal more than twelve legions of angels? But how then would the Scriptures

be fulfilled that say it must happen in this way?"

Women: Jesus, knowing all that was going to happen to him, went out and asked them,

Leader: "Who is it you want?"

Cong.: "Jesus of Nazareth!"

Leader: "I am he."

Women: (And Judas the traitor was standing there with them.) When Jesus said, "I am

he," they drew back and fell to the ground. Again he asked them,

Leader: "Who is it you want?"

Cong.: "Jesus of Nazareth!"

Leader: "I told you that I am he. If you are looking for me, then let these men go."

Women: This happened so that the words he had spoken would be fulfilled:

Men: "I have not lost one of those you gave me."

Women: The men seized Jesus and arrested him. Jesus said,

Leader: "Am I leading a rebellion that you have come out with swords and clubs to cap-

ture me? Every day I was with you, teaching in the temple courts, and you did

not arrest me. But the Scriptures must be fulfilled."

Cong.: Then all the disciples deserted him and fled. A young man, wearing nothing but a

linen garment, was following Jesus. When they seized him, he fled naked, leaving

his garment behind.

EPISTLE LESSON Romans 5: 1-11

Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have gained access by faith into this grace in which we now stand. And we boast in the hope of the glory of God. Not only so, but we also glory in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance; perseverance, character; and character, hope. And hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.

You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him! For if, while we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life! Not only is this so, but we also boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.

SERMON TEXT Mark 8: 27-38

Jesus and his disciples went on to the villages around Caesarea Philippi. On the way he asked them, "Who do people say I am?"

They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets."

"But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?"

Peter answered, "You are the Messiah."

Jesus warned them not to tell anyone about him.

He then began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests and the teachers of the law, and that he must be killed and after three days rise again. He spoke plainly about this, and Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him.

But when Jesus turned and looked at his disciples, he rebuked Peter. "Get behind me, Satan!" he said. "You do not have in mind the concerns of God, but merely human concerns."

Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples and said: "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me and for the gospel will save it. What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul? If anyone is ashamed of me and my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, the Son of Man will be ashamed of them when he comes in his Father's glory with the holy angels."
