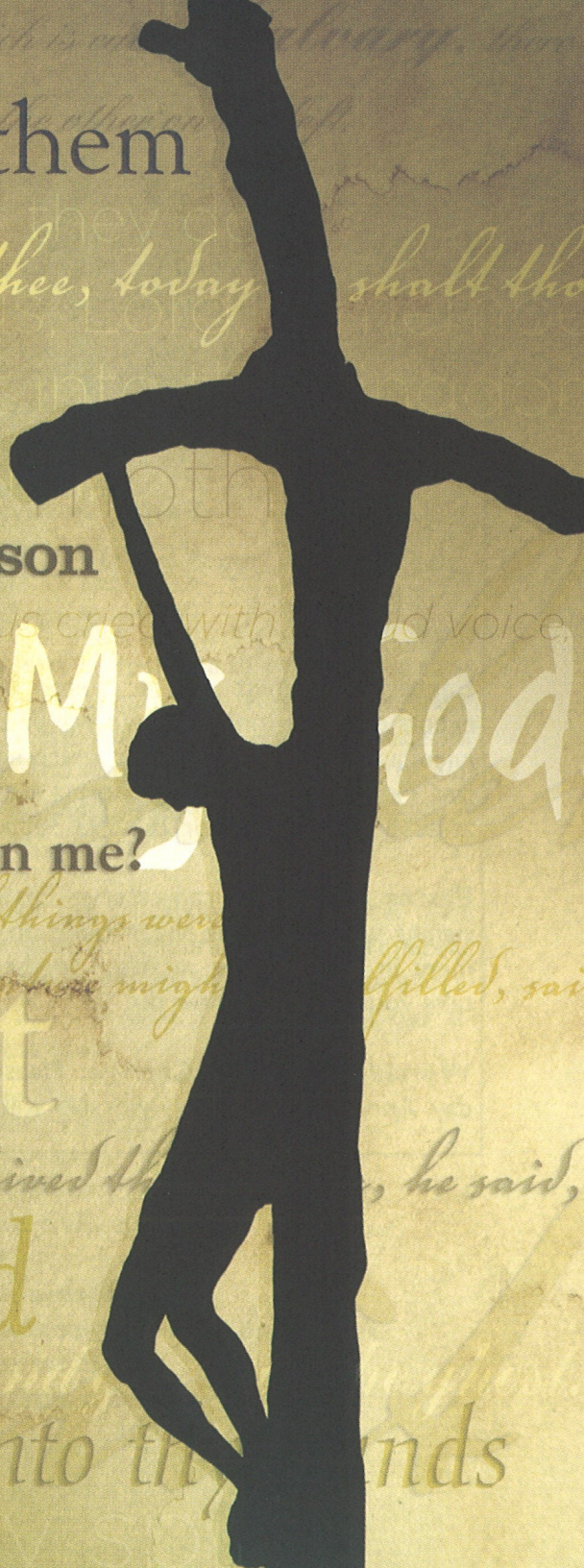

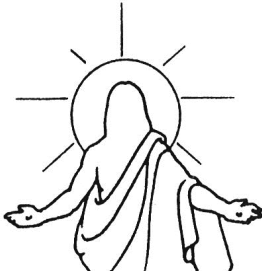

HOLY WEEK & EASTER

Holy Saturday Worship: Holy Saturday worship with the Lord's Supper will be held Saturday, April 16 at 5:00 pm. Join us as we wait in expectant anticipation of Jesus' resurrection.



Easter Sunrise Worship: This early morning Easter worship service with the Lord's Supper will begin at 6:30 am on Sunday, April 17 and will be completely different from our later services.

Easter Festival Worship: Our later Easter morning services with the Lord's Supper will begin at 8:00 am, 9:15 am, and 10:30 am on Sunday, April 17. These special services will focus on the glorious resurrection of our Savior in Word and song led by our choirs.

Easter Breakfast will be offered on Easter Sunday, April 17, from 7:15-10:15 am in the events center gymnasium. We will be serving baked eggs, ham, hashbrowns and bakery items, juice, and coffee. Welcome, Visitors! If you are visiting, please sign the guest book or a guest card (found in the gathering area) and come back and worship with us soon! We are happy to have you worship with us today.

Offerings can be deposited into the labeled boxes as you exit.

Bulletins can be taken home with you or deposited into recycling containers as you exit.

Available Services: Our ushers are glad to provide **large print bulletins** for those who need them. Our **hearing induction loop system** is functional throughout the sanctuary and works through the T coil function of hearing aid apparatuses. **Restrooms** are in the coatroom area and the parents' room. Parents are welcome to use the **parents' room** in the corner of our sanctuary. You can hear and view the service there. You will find a **diaper changing station** in the parents' room and in both restrooms located in the coatroom area.

Tenebrae: On Good Friday, the church remembers the crucifixion of her Lord, Jesus Christ. Traditionally this day has been celebrated with a Tenebrae service. Tenebrae means "darkness." Our service tonight is not a message of gloom, but a service of adoration of the Son of God as he offers up his life as the Lamb of God. We will center our attention on the seven "words" spoken by Jesus from the cross.

Tonight you will notice the following parts of our Tenebrae worship:

- † A bare altar: Christ's abandonment before his passion.
- † Silence before the service: Time for quiet meditation.
- † Extinguishing of the candles: The suffering Jesus endured.
- † Disappearance of last candle: The moment of Jesus' death.
- † Loud sound at end of service: Death's power defeated.
- † Lighting of the last candle: Anticipates Jesus' resurrection.
- † The draping of the cross: Jesus' body removed and buried.
- † Silence after the service: Time for quiet reflection.

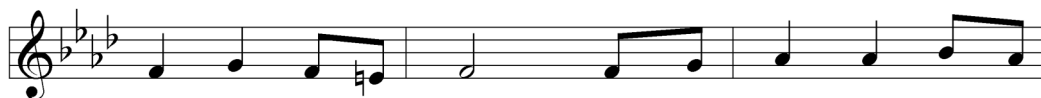

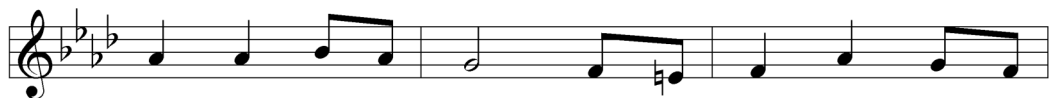
