Christian Duty

Some people feel that the duty of the Christian church is to help make the world a better place to live. They say the church should openly support causes that help solve the social, political, and economic problems that trouble our world. There is no doubt that the Bible teaches that Christians should have a concern for the poor, and feed the hungry, and clothe the naked. In doing such things, Christians do help make the world a better place to live.

In ancient times, salt was used primarily to prevent decay and keep food from spoiling, not so much for making food taste better. With this idea in mind, Jesus said that believers in him are the “salt of the earth.”

Jesus understood better than anyone that this world is a rotten place in many ways, and that by nature people are totally corrupt and spoiled. Into this moral decay God has placed the Christian church—people who know and love the Savior—so that his people might be salt to slow down and prevent the world from becoming even worse than it is.

The church’s main duty is not to make the world a better place by making life easier for people. Rather, it is to stem the moral decay that will bring total ruin in the end. What this world needs more than better living conditions is better hearts, not fewer poor people, but fewer bad people. When Christians stop understanding that, they lose their “saltiness” and become worthless.

How important it is for Christians to not adopt the immoral ways of the world, otherwise they help to increase the corruption they’re called to hinder. Christians will often complain about the flagrant and open wickedness that has permeated our society. They may reminisce about years ago when there were more people going to church, more babies being baptized, more families praying together.

But that’s the point, isn’t it? Christians themselves bear blame for the increasingly greater decay of our culture, because it is Christians who have chosen to adopt the lifestyle, thinking, and ways of the world’s corruption. Christians who spend countless hours watching TV programs that belittle the family structure God established; Christians who have made popular music that glorifies what God forbids part of their everyday diet; Christians who chase after money, possessions, pleasure, and status like everyone else.

Jesus desires that we examine how much saltiness we have lost. The salt in Jesus’ day was never pure, nor are we. Like everyone else in this world, we too have a corrupted nature. But we should know better. Make it your goal each day to examine your life, using the 10 commandments, to help you see where your failures and weaknesses are. Review your catechism regularly, which will lead you to those parts of Scripture that remind us of our natural condition, and guide us to the good news of the gospel where we will find comfort, strength, and relief in the forgiveness of sins that Jesus won for us. Let’s become more salty so that what God wants above all, more people to believe in Christ, will happen. Then you’ll find less reason to complain about the world we live in.

“You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot.” (Matthew 5.13)

The Lutheran Women's Missionary Society (LWMS) will host the Milwaukee Metro North Fall Rally at Christ Pewaukee on Saturday, October 22. Pastor Paul and Aneela will be the guest speakers. The event begins at 8:00 am with breakfast and ends at noon. It is open to all WELS women and supports our missionaries both at home and abroad. New Hymnals

The leadership of our church has decided to purchase the new Christian Worship Service Builder (software with annual printing license) to the new WELS hymnbook and also to purchase the physical hymnbooks to be placed into our pews. We realize this is a large step because worship is at the center of our church and in our lives of faith. We seek to do this and all things to the glory of God.

What will this mean for our worship? We presently print out the worship service information in bulletins for every service. At this point, we will continue our present practice. This will mean little, if any, noticeable changes. There are some new hymns that would be introduced over the course of time. We will eventually spend some time introducing the book to the congregation. We will consider using some new liturgical songs. This will be a gradual process. During COVID we simplified our worship to keep services withing an hour and to reduce singing.

What will this cost? A book, along with shipping, handling, and printing, costs \$28. We are purchasing 700 books. Our total costs would be close to \$20,000. These monies will be taken from our Memorial Fund and would be paid from the gifts given in memory of others, living and departed.

What can I do to help? Individual books can be purchased for \$28. Envelopes for such hymnal purchases should be available in the gathering area. Please also supply any dedication information in the envelopes as well. As in years past, should you like to dedicate a book to your relative or friend, templates of such dedications can be placed in the front cover of the book by our office staff.

If you would like to give a greater gift, it would be greatly appreciated. Once again, the total for all books will be about \$20,000. Speak to Pastor Krause if you would like to help in this matter.

The books should be in our pews by early September. Take a closer look as you have the opportunity. Please pray that the Lord blesses this decision and that his name continues to be praised in our lives and here at Christ Lutheran.

From Your Parish Nurses... "Sepsis"

What is sepsis?

- According to the CDC, sepsis is the body's extreme response to an infection. Sepsis is a medical emergency and should be treated immediately. Sepsis occurs when an infection you already have triggers a chain reaction throughout your body. Without timely treatment, sepsis can lead to tissue damage, organ failure, and death.
- Sepsis affects at least 1.7 million adults in America.
- Sepsis can affect anyone at any age but those at higher risk include those who are 65 years or older, have a weakened immune system, have had sepsis in the past, who are under 1 years old, and those who have chronic medical conditions.

Signs and symptoms include:

- Fast heart rate and /or low blood pressure
- Confusion, altered mental status, or difficult to arouse
- Extreme pain or discomfort
- Fever and/ or chills
- Shortness of breath
- Infection

If you or a loved one develops a combination of the above symptoms (especially if suspicion or confirmation of an infection and /or recent cut or surgery), call 911 or be seen by a healthcare provider at your local ER immediately.

Steps to prevent sepsis:

- Prevent infection
- Practice good hygiene
- Know the symptoms
- ACT FAST!

Remember, if you suspect sepsis, get help right away or at a minimum contact your physician or tele health right away. Early recognition is key for recovery!
