Listen Up!

*He who answers before listening—that is his folly and shame.
(Proverbs 18:13)*

Carl Smith noted in an article “How Can Parents Model Good Listening Skills?” that parents need to learn to listen more closely to their children so they can become better parents. Here are some of his suggestions.

- **Be interested and attentive:** Children can tell whether they have a parent’s interest and attention by the way the parent replies or does not reply. Forget about your phone and other distractions. Maintain eye contact to show you really are with the child.
- **Encourage talking:** Some children need an invitation to start talking. They are more likely to share their ideas and feelings when others think them important.
- **Listen patiently:** People think faster than they speak. Children often take longer than adults to find the right word. Listen as though you have plenty of time.
- **Hear children out:** Avoid cutting children off before they have finished speaking. It is easy to form an opinion or reject children’s views before they finish what they have to say. It may be difficult to listen respectfully and not correct misconceptions but respect their right to have and express their opinions.
- **Listen to nonverbal messages:** Many messages children send are communicated nonverbally by their tone of voice, facial expressions, energy level, posture, or changes in their behavior patterns. You can often tell more from the way a child speaks something than from what is said.

This is good, common-sense advice for parents and children, as well as for any human relationship.

But the most important listening is when our heavenly Father speaks. He has wonderful things to tell such as the fact that he loves us and proved it by sending his Son to die for us in order to forgive our sins and offer eternal life to everyone. On top of this, he promises to always listen to his children. He invites us to share with him anything that’s on our minds—from unloading guilt we feel from our sin to unloading on him all the fears and stress that inflict us. He wants to hear us share our troubles with him and he guarantees that he will act. In fact, he promises all believers in Christ, “Before they call I will answer; while they are still speaking I will hear” (Isaiah 65:24).

Set aside time every day to listen to your Lord speak to you in his Word. And follow that up with prayer, in full confidence that he is listening and will give you either what you ask for—or something even better.

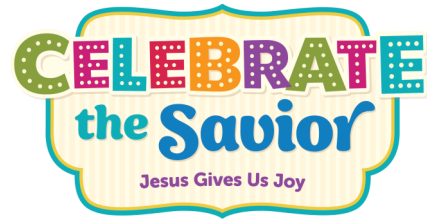

From Your Parish Nurses... **Sunscreen and Skin Cancer**

Who should use sunscreen?

In short, everyone should use sunscreen. This includes men, women, children, and those who tan easily or don't typically burn. The only exception to this is children under 6 months old as their skin is very sensitive. For children under 6 months it is important to keep them out of direct sunlight.

Why should I use sunscreen?

Although spending time outside is good for your health, being in the sun without using protection can cause damage to your skin. Skin cancer is the most common type of cancer in the United States. Most skin cancers are caused by UV light. It is just as important to wear sunscreen during non-summer months as it is during summer months. It is also important to wear sunscreen on cloudy days as UV lights can penetrate through the clouds and cause sunburn.

What type of sunscreen should I use?

Use a sunscreen that is SPF 15 or more. Chemical and mineral sunscreens are both proven to provide effective protection, although mineral sunscreen is less likely to cause skin irritation. If you are swimming, use a waterproof sunscreen. Make sure to reapply every two hours and right after swimming or sweating.

Other tips to prevent sunburn:

- Wear clothing that protects skin. This includes hats and sunglasses.
- Increase shade - Have tents available for outdoor gatherings or play in the shade of a tree.
- Avoid scheduling outdoor activities when the UV light is the strongest.
- Be aware of any medications that you take, as some medications can increase your risk of sunburn.

ELDER'S MESSAGE

In Ecclesiastes (meaning teacher or preacher), Solomon shares some of his God given wisdom with us all with the familiar words "What has been will be again, what has been done will be done again; there is nothing new under the sun" (Ecclesiastes 1:9). We all know that this applies to all sorts of things. And we need look no further than a short (relatively) list from St. Paul from approximately 2000 years ago to confirm how true these words of Solomon are. In Romans 1: 29-30, "They have become filled with every kind of wickedness, evil, greed and depravity. They are full of envy, murder, strife, deceit and malice. They are gossips, slanderers, God-haters, insolent, arrogant and boastful; they invent ways of doing evil; they disobey their parents;" (and the list goes on). Anything from this list missing from today?! But focusing on the negative is something I am all too ready and willing to do (how about you?). So let's take some other biblical words, also written by St. Paul to consider from Philipians 4:8, "Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things." I need help with this because my "old Adam" and Satan want me to fixate on that former list that is not "new under the sun" – to gripe and complain, be bitter and get so agitated that I can make myself sick. But there is "nothing new under the sun" with Paul's words in Philipian's either. There have always been and always will be Christians who bask in God's glory, live their life under his grace, and are able to view the God given goodness that continues to permeate our world just as it did in St. Paul's day. Pray to our crucified and Risen Savior that he will bless you (and me!) with the gift of "thinking about such things" and living as if we know it is true! And after praying, how about spending some extra time in God's word by reading your bible, in Church services and Bible studies, where the Holy Spirit can bless you and strengthen the gift you have prayed for. Support, encouragement, and fellowship are as close as the person next to you in the pew at church or the seat next to you in bible study. Maybe we could all do with a little more of that.
