Lighthouses and Life Rafts

I met an interesting couple at the farmers market today. As we spoke, they explained that he and his wife both serve as “Court Appointed Special Advocates”. They have been appointed by the court to supervise and monitor foster families. They visit their homes. They advise the foster parents. They make sure the children are receiving the care and guidance they need while in foster care.

When we spoke, the husband told me a piece of advice their supervisor had given them. “Remember... you are lighthouses not life rafts.”

The foster parents were the life rafts. They were the ones living with the children, caring for them and taking care of them. As advocates, this man and his wife couldn’t be that for all the children. They supervise a number of children in a variety of different foster homes. They simply couldn’t be life rafts for all of them. Their job was to be a lighthouse. Their job was to be a light, guiding and helping the foster parents. Their job was to be a beacon, making sure the children were safe and well taken care of.

As a pastor, I can relate. God could use me as a life raft. I could become ultimately involved in people’s lives. I could spend hours and even days with them, holding their hands as they face every difficult decision or dark day. But I cannot be there for all of my faith family 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. I simply can’t be a life raft for everybody.

God has called me to be a lighthouse. My job is to shine the light of God’s love to a variety of different people. My job is to guide them with the light of God’s Word and promises. My job is to help them, support them and show them the way – Jesus.

Don’t misunderstand me. Life rafts are important, too. God maybe hasn’t called you to be a lighthouse. You may not have the gifts or opportunity to influence and guide a large number of people. God maybe has put one or two people in your life – a friend, a child, a grandchild, a parent. You may need to focus most, if not all your attention on them. God may have called you to be their life raft, to be the one person they need to carry them where God wants them to be.

In the end, God uses both life rafts and lighthouses to help people. God uses both life rafts and lighthouses to lead people to Jesus and to get them to heaven. But it’s not always easy to figure out which God has called you to be in another person’s life. Just like these foster children advocates, it is helpful when we can understand what our role is and what is the best way we can serve God and help others.

May our Lord give each of us the wisdom we need every day to know if he is calling us to be life rafts or lighthouses to the people around us. May he give us the love to joyfully and willingly be what he has called us to be, all to God’s glory!

Parents: When dropping off or picking up your children for Sunday School, please park your vehicle in the parking lot and walk with your children in and out of the church building. **Please do not park your vehicle anywhere in the circle drive in the upper level main entryway and canopy area of the church.** There are many elderly and handicapped members who have difficulty getting into the entryway to our church because of the number of vehicles in the circle. There is one section of the entryway where the curb is sloped for wheelchairs and walkers. There is one handicapped accessible door in the entryway. It is important that these areas are not blocked. This is also a designated fire lane and emergency vehicle area.

Reminder that by law our **handicapped parking spaces** are reserved for those who have a handicapped parking permit.

In his explanation of the Apostles Creed, Luther added the statement familiar to everyone who’s gone through confirmation class, “This is Most Certainly True,” which marked more than the end of a long paragraph of memory work. It was an appropriate response because when God speaks to us in his Word about who he is, what he’s done for us, and what he continues to do for us, he speaks the truth and our faith agrees. In this sermon series, we will review some of the basics of our Christian faith, and we pray that God will use his Word to give us even more certainty in our faith and the peace that comes from knowing what we know.

ELDERS’ MESSAGE

Well done good and faithful servant!

In Matthew 25:14-30, Jesus tells the parable of the ‘talents’ or ‘bags of gold.’ In this account, he teaches us about stewardship. A steward is someone who manages another’s property or financial affairs. A master entrusts his servants with wealth, leaves for a while and when he returns, he is pleased with those servants who have put that wealth into use.

How does this parable apply to us? It is important that we see ourselves as stewards. Everything we have – our time, talents, abilities, and possessions – have been given to us by our Lord who encourages us to be faithful with them. A servant seeks their master’s honor. As servants of Christ, we find joys in using our ‘talents’ in ways that glorify Him and further His Kingdom.

The warning in this parable is not to be lazy with the things God has given us. It is also important that we aren’t selfish and use our ‘talents’ only to further our own purposes.

When we fail to be good stewards, we take comfort in the fact that our Lord and master is also our Savior. He demonstrated His service and faithfulness to us by giving himself up for us so that our failures have been forgiven. What a wonderful Savior we have! From Your Parish Nurses...

Gastroesophageal Reflux Disease (GERD)

Gastroesophageal reflux disease (GERD) occurs when the stomach acid repeatedly flows back into the esophagus. When this backwash (acid reflux) happens it can irritate the lining of the esophagus.

Common symptoms of GERD are:

- heartburn, usually after eating, it may be worse at night or while lying down
- regurgitation of food or sour liquid
- upper abdominal or chest pain
- trouble swallowing
- nausea
- chronic cough or hoarseness

Conditions that can increase your risk of GERD:

- Pregnancy
- A hiatal hernia (bulging of the top of the stomach up above the diaphragm)
- Obesity
- Delayed stomach emptying

Things that can aggravate acid reflux:

- Eating large meals or eating late at night
- Eating fatty or fried foods, acidic foods, spicy foods
- Smoking
- Drinking caffeinated beverages or alcohol
- taking certain medications such as aspirin

Treatment for GERD:

- Make lifestyle changes such as: losing weight if overweight, quit smoking if you smoke, change eating habits and diet, eating meals at least 3 hrs before going to bed, elevate your head while sleeping
- Using over-the-counter medications such as antacids, Famotidine (Pepcid, Zantac), Cimetidine (Tagamet), Omeprazole (Prilosec) or Lansoprazole (Prevacid).

If your symptoms persist or if you have to take medication daily for more than 2 weeks you should consult with your doctor. Seek immediate medical care if you have chest pain along with shortness of breath, jaw pain or arm pain as these may be signs of a heart attack. (Sources: nick.nih.gov, mayoclinic.org)
