Singing in the Shower

Psalm 105:2 – Sing to the Lord, sing praise to him.

Singing plays an enormous role in people's lives. We sing on people's birthdays. We sing along with the radio in our cars or with the Apple Music in our earbuds. We sing lullabies to put babies to sleep. And yes, we might even sing in the shower!

We also do a lot of singing in church. And even if you're not a big singer anywhere else, you know that when you come to church there will be singing. There is a good reason why we sing so much in our worship services. Singing and music in general is one of God's gifts to us and a way in which we can praise him and proclaim his word.

Consider all the singing during the holiday seasons at church. We have a lot of songs and hymns to sing at Christmas. Lent has its own set of hymns too. And so does Easter. Could you imagine a Christmas without Christmas music? Or Lent without those Lenten hymns? Or Easter morning without the Easter hymns? Thankfully that's not the case. We have a hymnal filled with hymns and songs that call to mind all that Christ accomplished. In fact, some of those hymns are so good that their words and melodies transport us right to the manger, the cross, or the empty tomb. The spoken word doesn't always do that, does it?

That's probably why we revert to singing songs and hymns during difficult times of our lives. At the death of a loved one, in the midst of a prolonged illness, when facing challenges within our family or at our job or in school, there is nothing more powerful than the message of God's Word put to song. The words and melodies have a way of speaking about how we're feeling even if we can't quite pinpoint what's bothering us. The powerful words and rich melodies warm our hearts and feed our faith by bringing us the love of Jesus at a critical time in our life. Hymns like "Be Still My Soul" or "Amazing Grace" or "In Christ Alone" or "Abide with Me." Which hymns lift you up when life gets difficult?

What a blessing that God's words are put to music for us in a wealth of hymns and songs to sing. So let's sing to the Lord, sing praise to him!

ELDER'S MESSAGE

I got the call from my older sister Denise saying that I should make the trip down as soon as possible. "Now would be a good time..." With that I hung up the phone, informed my co-workers I would be leaving and raced down from Brookfield to Racine. When I arrived at my younger sister's house, both Michelle and Denise were there to greet me. My mom had passed. I burst into tears.

After composing myself, I went into the bedroom that my mom had been staying in since going into Hospice a few weeks earlier. After sharing a quiet moment, with my sisters in the room with me I held my mom's hand and said; "May the Lord bless you and keep you. May the Lord make his face shine upon you. May the Lord look upon you with favor and grant you peace..." (Numbers 6:24-26)

As sad as that moment was, it was also a moment of celebration. My mom was now free of the vessel, her body that had been so compromised following a stroke. In my mind I had pictured her, young and vibrant, living pain free in Heaven with her friends and our relatives who had gone before.

Each and every day brings new challenges, some welcome, some not. It is not the challenges that are the issue, it is how we deal with them. Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ is with us every step of the way, even if it sometimes doesn't feel that way.

Knowing that you are never spiritually alone is a gift from God as he shares his love, grace and power with us.

I love the fact that when we close most of the services we end it with Numbers 6:24-26. When it is being said, I usually look up through the giant window above the altar, through the cross and into the sky towards Heaven knowing that one day I too will have the opportunity to spend the rest of my time there, pain free and guilt free.

Whenever I have moments of doubt or stress, I always go back to Numbers 6:24-26. A simple, powerful reminder that I am never alone to face whatever is before me.

From Your Parish Nurses... What Is Gallbladder Disease?

Gallbladder disease includes inflammation, infection, stones or blockage of the gallbladder. The gallbladder is a sac located under the liver. It stores and concentrates bile produced in the liver. Bile aids in the digestion of fat and is released from the gallbladder into the upper small intestine in response to food (especially fats). Two of the most common types of gallbladder disease include: cholecystitis (inflammation of the gallbladder) and gallstones.

Gallstones may cause no signs or symptoms. If a gallstone lodges in a duct and causes a blockage, the resulting signs and symptoms may include:

- Sudden and rapidly intensifying pain in the upper right portion of your abdomen
- Sudden and rapidly intensifying pain in the center of your abdomen, just below your breastbone
- Back pain between your shoulder blades
- Pain in your right shoulder
- Nausea or vomiting

Between 1-3% of people with gallstone symptoms develop acute cholecystitis, which occurs when stones or sludge block the duct. The symptoms are similar to those of biliary colic but are more persistent and severe. They include pain in the upper right abdomen that is severe and constant and may last for days. Pain frequently increases when drawing a breath. About a third of patients have fever and chills. Nausea and vomiting may occur.

Diagnosis includes blood tests, ultrasound and other imaging techniques like a CT scan.

Surgery may be warranted to remove the gallbladder if the patient has gallstones or the gallbladder is not functioning normally. Most of the time this can be performed either laparoscopically (through small incisions) or with robotic-assisted surgery, both as outpatient procedures.

If you have severe abdominal pain with or without a high fever with chills, please contact your primary care provider or seek care at an emergency department.

Charitable Giving Options

We are grateful for the many generous members who give their first fruits to the Lord, either through online giving or physical offerings at church. Did you know there are other ways you can give to church that also may offer tax benefits?

For those members that are at retirement age and are mandated to take Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) from their retirement savings, you can send up to \$100,000 per year to an operating charity using a strategy called a Qualified Charitable Donation (QCD). Based on tax rules, a QCD allows a donor to direct their distributions to a charity, satisfy the requirement to take a distribution from a retirement plan, and the proceeds are not reported as taxable income on one's personal tax returns. Contact the company that currently holds your retirement accounts to file the necessary forms to have your RMD proceeds sent to Christ.

Another option is to name Christ as a charitable beneficiary with a Donor Advised Fund (DAF). Many investment companies, brokerage houses, and mutual fund companies offer investors the option of setting up a donor advised fund where assets such as cash & stocks can be transferred into the DAF. The investor takes a tax deduction once the assets are transferred into a DAF and can then direct the sponsoring organization to send assets to a specified charity named as the charitable beneficiary. This option also would require an investor to contact their investment company about setting up a DAF and completing the necessary forms to have proceeds transferred into the DAF and then distributed to Christ.

Shares of stock or mutual funds can also be donated. This method can be tax advantageous if you would like to donate appreciated shares without paying capital gains taxes. The process involves completing a form with the company/brokerage house where you currently hold the shares.

As with any type of stewardship, retirement planning, and gifting to charity, it is advised for investors to first speak with their financial or tax professional to see if one of these options makes sense for each individual's financial situation.
