CONFESSION OF SINS AND FORGIVENESS

P: Through God's holy Word, the apostle Paul has called on us to have the same attitude as Christ Jesus. And so I ask you to humble yourselves before God and confess your sins.

GOSPEL LESSON *Matthew 21: 1-11*

As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage on the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, “Go to the village ahead of you, and at once you will find a donkey tied there, with her colt by her. Untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, say that the Lord needs them, and he will send them right away.”

This took place to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet:

“Say to Daughter Zion,

‘See, your king comes to you,

gentle and riding on a donkey,

and on a colt, the foal of a donkey.’”

The disciples went and did as Jesus had instructed them. They brought the donkey and the colt and placed their cloaks on them for Jesus to sit on. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, while others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and those that followed shouted,

“Hosanna to the Son of David!”

“Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!”

“Hosanna in the highest heaven!”

When Jesus entered Jerusalem, the whole city was stirred and asked, “Who is this?”

The crowds answered, “This is Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth in Galilee.”

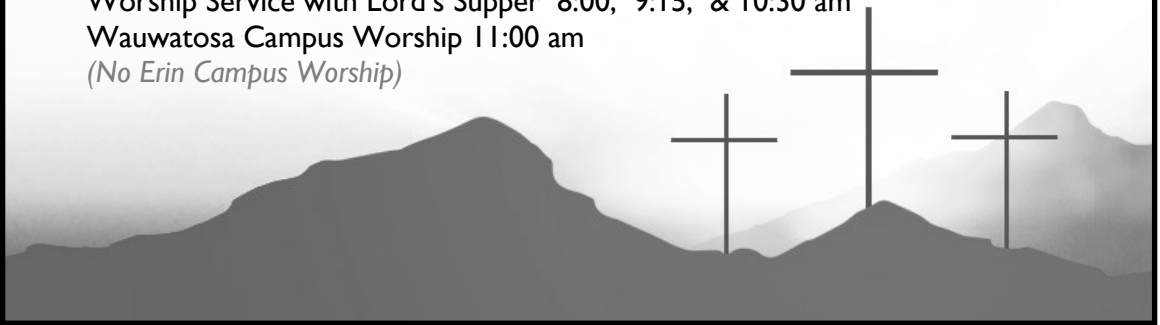

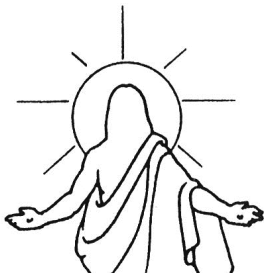


Maundy Thursday Worship: On Thursday, April 14 our Maundy Thursday worship services with the Lord's Supper will be held at 12:00 pm and 7:00 pm.

Good Friday Worship: Good Friday worship services will be held Friday, April 15 at 9:00 am, 12:00 pm, and 7:00 pm. The evening worship, our annual Tenebrae service, will be completely different than our morning and noon services. Tenebrae is the Latin word for darkness. The terrible darkness that marked that first Good Friday is symbolized as the church is darkened during the course of the service while we meditate on Jesus' seven words spoken from the cross.



Holy Saturday Worship: Holy Saturday worship with the Lord's Supper will be held Saturday, April 16 at 5:00 pm. Join us as we wait in expectant anticipation of Jesus' resurrection.



Easter Sunrise Worship: This early morning Easter worship service with the Lord's Supper will begin at 6:30 am on Sunday, April 17 and will be completely different from our later services.
