"Short prayers are long enough."

Those are not my words. A well-known preacher named Charles Spurgeon said that. A statement like that does get you thinking, doesn't it? We typically give a lot of thought to what we pray and for whom we pray, but how often do we think about the length of our prayers? Martin Luther commented, "The fewer the words the better the prayer."

Thankfully, there are no rules and laws we must follow when it comes to our prayers. Our prayers flow from hearts of faith in Jesus. They flow from forgiven and trusting hearts. They flow fully confident that the Lord hears every word. So, the Christian prays.

We do pray longer prayers too, not just short ones. Just as we have different kinds of conversations with people, we have different kinds of communication with God. There's no right or wrong length.

We pray privately by ourselves and publicly as a group. There are special advantages to both.

We can buy books with prayers. Even a quick internet search provides a prayer for any and every occasion. As with anything online, be careful and test it with what the Scriptures say. Did you know the book of the Psalms is an outstanding prayer book? Pick one, pray it, and see what you think. What about your hymnal? You might find it helpful to use the time before worship to silently pray a verse or two of your favorite hymn.

And I know, it's not always easy to pray. Our sinful flesh will always see our prayer time as a burden. So set aside time to pray. Clear your mind and relax. Jesus often withdrew alone to a quiet place to pray. Do you have a place like that? Think about your own sins, needs, and weaknesses. Consider the needs of others. And then speak to your heavenly Father.

Husbands, pray with your wives. Parents, pray with your children. "The family that prays together stays together" may be an oversimplification, but there is truth in it. A fuller prayer life is a beneficial and unifying force within the family.

When you're not sure what to pray, feel free to pray the most used prayer in history: the Lord's Prayer. Jesus taught it to us, and I think it's safe to say that you all know it by heart.

There's more that could be said about prayer. It's my prayer that the Spirit continue to work through God's Word to lead you to pray continually.

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4:6-7)

ELDER'S MESSAGE

Recently, my wife and I went on a guided trip to Israel, along with 38 others. Bethlehem, unlike what the hymn suggests in "Oh little town of Bethlehem", was a hustling, bustling town with a traffic jam and the constant sound of car horns.

As we were walking through the town, making our way to the Church of the Nativity, it was wise to make sure that you could always hear and see the guide so that you wouldn't get lost. After touring the church and some other sites, we headed back to our bus. A head count was done - one, two, three, ... thirty nine. Thirty nine?! Only thirty nine?! There should be forty! Someone was missing. Has anyone seen her?! Where could she be?! The guide left the rest of us behind to look for the lost one.

Praise be to God! She was found and was now safe with the rest of the group. It turns out that she was distracted by something, strayed, and lost track of the group. She didn't stay close to the guide.

What happens to us when we are distracted by other things in life and neglect to worship? At first, you may not even notice that your guide (Jesus) is out of sight. You may even think to yourself "No worries. I'll catch up." But after a while longer, you may not know how to get back.

The Elders in our congregation are called upon to look for those members who may have strayed away. Whether it's a phone call, text message, or a knock on the door, our concern is to help that person find their way back to the guide.

If you are one of those who have been contacted by one of our Elders, please seriously and prayerfully consider what they are saying to you. As everyone on our bus in Israel cheered and celebrated when that lost person walked on to the bus, so does our congregation as you walk back through the church doors.

From Your Parish Nurses... Colon Cancer

Colorectal cancer is growth of cancer cells in the colon or rectum, the third most common cancer diagnosed in both men and women, and the third most common case of cancer-related deaths. It is highly preventable, treatable, and often curable. Since the mid 1980's, the rate of people being diagnosed has decreased mainly because more people are getting screened and changing their lifestyle related risk factors. On the other hand, colorectal cancer diagnosis has been climbing in people under the age of 50 and more are being diagnosed at advanced stages.

Who's at isk?

- Those over the age of 50
- Those who have a personal or family history of benign polyps, colorectal cancer, inflammatory bowel disease, ulcerative colitis or Crohn's disease
- Those who use tobacco, drink excessive alcohol, are overweight, or do not have an active lifestyle

Recognize the Symptoms: If early warning signs such as polyps are not detected, symptoms may not show for years and that is why regular screening is necessary. When symptoms do show up they include:

- A change in bowel habits (diarrhea or constipation)
- Bright red or dark blood in stool
- Stools that are narrower than usual
- Abdominal discomfort
- Weight loss for no known reason
- Constant fatigue or anemia

Early colorectal cancer has no symptoms, so regular screening is vital for early detection. The recommended age to begin screening was lowered from 50 years old to 45 in 2021. It is also recommended that people with an increased risk or those with a family history of colon cancer should begin screening earlier. There are several screening tests that can be used to find colorectal cancer, including some you can do at home. Current screening methods are colonoscopy, stool DNA test, and fecal occult blood test. Talk with your doctor about which test would be right for you.

Ways to lower your risk of colorectal cancer:

- Eat a variety of fruits, vegetables, and whole grains. Limit intake of processed and red meats.
- If you smoke, stop smoking.
- Drink alcohol in moderation, if at all.
- Maintain a healthy weight.
- · Be physically active.
