



- P: Our Savior Jesus Christ commanded Baptism when he said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. EPISTLE LESSON Acts 2: 14a, 22-36

Then Peter stood up with the Eleven, raised his voice and addressed the crowd:

"Fellow Israelites, listen to this: Jesus of Nazareth was a man accredited by God to you by miracles, wonders and signs, which God did among you through him, as you yourselves know. This man was handed over to you by God's deliberate plan and foreknowledge; and you, with the help of wicked men, put him to death by nailing him to the cross. But God raised him from the dead, freeing him from the agony of death, because it was impossible for death to keep its hold on him. David said about him:

"I saw the Lord always before me.

Because he is at my right hand,
I will not be shaken.

Therefore my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices;
my body also will rest in hope,
because you will not abandon me to the realm of the dead,
you will not let your holy one see decay.

You have made known to me the paths of life;
you will fill me with joy in your presence.'

"Fellow Israelites, I can tell you confidently that the patriarch David died and was buried, and his tomb is here to this day. But he was a prophet and knew that God had promised him on oath that he would place one of his descendants on his throne. Seeing what was to come, he spoke of the resurrection of the Messiah, that he was not abandoned to the realm of the dead, nor did his body see decay. God has raised this Jesus to life, and we are all witnesses of it. Exalted to the right hand of God, he has received from the Father the promised Holy Spirit and has poured out what you now see and hear. For David did not ascend to heaven, and yet he said,

"The Lord said to my Lord:
"Sit at my right hand
until I make your enemies
a footstool for your feet."

"Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah."

GOSPEL LESSON John 3: 1-17

Now there was a Pharisee, a man named Nicodemus who was a member of the Jewish ruling council. He came to Jesus at night and said, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God. For no one could perform the signs you are doing if God were not with him."

Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again."

"How can someone be born when they are old?" Nicodemus asked. "Surely they cannot enter a second time into their mother's womb to be born!"


Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit. Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit. You should not be surprised at my saying, 'You must be born again.' The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit."

"How can this be?" Nicodemus asked.

"You are Israel's teacher," said Jesus, "and do you not understand these things? Very truly I tell you, we speak of what we know, and we testify to what we have seen, but still you people do not accept our testimony. I have spoken to you of earthly things and you do not believe; how then will you believe if I speak of heavenly things? No one has ever gone into heaven except the one who came from heaven—the Son of Man. Just as Moses lifted up the snake in the wilderness, so the Son of Man must be lifted up, that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him."

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him.

SERMON TEXT Isaiah 6: 1-8

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on a throne; and the train of his robe filled the temple. Above him were seraphim, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. And they were calling to one another:

"Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory."

At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke.

"Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the Lord Almighty."

Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. With it he touched my mouth and said, "See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for."

Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" And I said. "Here am I. Send me!"

SERMON THEME: HOLY, HOLY, HOLY IS THE LORD GOD ALMIGHTY

- I. The holiness of God.
- II. The confession of sin.
- III. The cleansing of Christ.
- IV. My response to the call of the Lord.

THE ATHANASIAN CREED

- P: Whoever wishes to be saved must, above all else, hold to the true Christian faith.
- C: Whoever does not keep this faith pure in all points will certainly perish forever.
- P: Now this is the true Christian faith:
- C: We worship one God in three persons and three persons in one God, without mixing the persons or dividing the divine being.
- P: For each person—the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit—is distinct, but the deity of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, equal in glory and coeternal in majesty.
- C: What the Father is, so is the Son, and so is the Holy Spirit.

- P: The Father is uncreated, the Son uncreated, the Holy Spirit uncreated; the Father is infinite, the Son infinite, the Holy Spirit infinite; the Father is eternal, the Son eternal, the Holy Spirit eternal;
- C: Yet they are not three who are eternal, but there is one who is eternal, just as they are not three who are uncreated, nor three who are infinite, but there is one who is uncreated and one who is infinite.
- P: In the same way the Father is almighty, the Son is almighty, and the Holy Spirit is almighty;
- C: Yet they are not three who are almighty, but there is one who is almighty.
- P: So the Father is God, the Son is God, the Holy Spirit is God;
- C: Yet they are not three Gods, but one God.
- P: So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, the Holy Spirit is Lord;
- C: Yet they are not three Lords, but one Lord.
- P: For just as Christian truth compels us to confess each person individually to be God and Lord,
- C: So the true Christian faith forbids us to speak of three Gods or three Lords.
- P: The Father is neither made nor created nor begotten of anyone. The Son is neither made nor created, but is begotten of the Father alone. The Holy Spirit is neither made nor created nor begotten, but proceeds from the Father and the Son.
- C: So there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits.
- P: And within this Trinity none comes before or after; none is greater or inferior, but all three persons are coequal and coeternal,
- C: So that in every way, as stated before, all three persons are to be worshiped as one God and one God worshiped as three persons.
- P: Whoever wishes to be saved must have this conviction of the Trinity.
- C: It is furthermore necessary for eternal salvation truly to believe that our Lord Jesus Christ also took on human flesh.
- P: Now this is the true Christian faith:
- C: We believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, is both God and man.

- P: He is God, eternally begotten from the nature of the Father, and he is man, born in time from the nature of his mother, fully God, fully man, with rational soul and human flesh,
- C: Equal to the Father as to his deity, less than the Father as to his humanity;
- P: And though he is both God and Man, Christ is not two persons but one, one, not by changing the deity into flesh, but by taking the humanity into God;
- C: One, indeed, not by mixture of the natures, but by unity in one person;
- P: For just as the rational soul and flesh are one human being, so God and man are one Christ.
- C: He suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose the third day from the dead. He ascended into heaven, is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty, and from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.
- P: At his coming all people will rise with their own bodies to answer for their personal deeds.
- C: Those who have done good will enter eternal life, but those who have done evil will go into eternal fire.
- P: This is the true Christian faith.
- C: Whoever does not faithfully and firmly believe this cannot be saved.

PRAYER

THE LORD'S PRAYER

C: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen.


