SERMON-BASED QUESTIONS

OCTOBER 30 + 31, 2021

MY STORY

1. Have you ever had a time where you were legitimately lost? Tell the story.
2. How would you navigate traveling if there were no GPS?

IN REVIEW

How did reading Romans go? What did you learn? What in Romans stood out to you most? Is there something you learned that has changed your heart?

DIGGING DEEPER

3. Pastor John talked about GPS and how that relates to our walk with Jesus. What do you use to navigate your spiritual life?
4. Read Luke 12:1-8 and answer the following questions:
 - a. Has there been a time recently where you have led others (or yourself) to believe that you are more “spiritual” or “holy” than what is true?
 - b. Reread verses 2-5 from above. What from these verses stands out to you most and why?
5. Read Luke 12:13-21 and answer the following questions:
 - a. In response to this man’s plea, Jesus shares a parable. What is this man’s problem? What is *his* solution? Why is he a fool?
 - b. Are there ways you can relate to this man? In what ways are you similar?
 - c. How do you invest in Heaven and eternity?

CALL TO ACTION | PERSONAL REFLECTION: This “Call To Action” should be personal (with you only and/or with your spouse). Reflect on and dig into these few questions throughout the next week: *What does an investment portfolio, guided by a desire to be “rich towards God”, look like for you? Areas such as financially (savings, giving, retirement, estate planning, etc.), personally (investing in or discipling others, ministering the heart of your children versus their actions/behavior, etc.), or professionally (in the workplace, outside of the home, etc.).*

6. Read Luke 12:22-40 and Philippians 4:8-9 and answer the following questions:
 - a. How do these two sections of Scripture coincide?
 - b. What causes worry, fear, or anxiety in your day-to-day life?
 - c. Consider the two routes below, then answer this question for each:
On each route, what worries, fears, or anxieties arise?
 - ❖ Route 1: Has an earthly perspective, seeking to follow God’s voice and wisdom, but looking to collect earthly gain as an end goal.
 - ❖ Route 2: An eternal perspective, aware of worldly conditions, but attuned to the Holy Spirit and seeking to build treasures in Heaven.
 - d. If you knew the number of days you had left on earth, would there be things you would do differently? Why or why not?

CALL TO ACTION | SET A DATE: Is there someone that is on your heart that you need to pursue? Maybe for forgiveness, sharing the Gospel, a hard or honest conversation, or something else? Set a date to meet with them. Respond to the urgency that the eternal perspective brings.
