## S - spiritual gifts What am I gifted to do?

## H - heart What do I love to do?

For it is God who works in you, inspiring both the will and the deed, for His own chosen purpose. Philippians 2:13b (NEB)

### A - abilities What natural abilities do I have?

There are different abilities to perform service. 1 Corinthians 12:6 (GNT)
I [God] have given him the skill, ability, and knowledge to do all kinds of work. Exodus 31:3b (NCV)
Our competence comes from God. 2 Corinthians 3:5b (NIV)

## P - personality Where does my personality best suit me to serve?

No one can really know what anyone else is thinking or what he is really like except that person himself. 1 Corinthians 2:11 (TLB)

### E - experiences What experiences have I had?

There is nothing better than for people to eat and drink and to see the good in their hard work. These beautiful gifts, I realized, too, come from God's hand. Ecclesiastes 2:24 (VOICE)

Your ministry will be most effective and fulfilling when you are using your gifts and abilities in the area of heart's desire in a way that best expresses your personality and experience!

### Some things to remember as you discover your S.H.A.P.E.:

Have fun as you work to discover your S.H.A.P.E.

This not a "test." There are no right or wrong answers. The purpose is to show how God made you a unique creation!

This is self-evaluating. No one is rating you on this. We're interested in your feelings, not the feelings of others. However, it may be helpful to ask for additional input from those closest to you after you've filled in your own responses.

The value of each of these discovery tools will vary depending on your age, how long you've been a Christian, your background, your honesty, and how much time and serious thinking you're willing to invest in them!

The gift of service edifies / compliments the gifts of others, freeing them from temporal tasks to focus on their spiritual gifts. People with the gift of service often like to work behind the scenes.
