8.	Read Mark 10:35-45 and answer the following questions: a. Reread verse 44. What does "being a slave to all" mean?

b. What are the most challenging situations for you to serve in?
c. Reread verse 45. Have you ever found yourself serving others to meet a personal need or to get something in return? In each "serving opportunity" presented in a given day, how can verse 45 play a role in awareness and the posture of our heart?
CALL TO ACTION SERVITUDE: Choose one thing that is practical and measurable that you can start doing (or stop doing) in your closest circle of people (family or friends) that would be an intentional step towards love, care, and service.
