

OUTNUMBERED, BUT NEVER OUTMATCHED

PSALM 3:1-8



INTRODUCTION / PROBLEM

Life often leaves us feeling outnumbered by trials, fear, suffering, anxiety, or the consequences of sin. David wrote Psalm 3 while fleeing from Absalom, yet learned to rest in the Lord.



MAIN IDEA

God hears, protects, sustains, and delivers those who trust in Him when the odds are stacked against them.

I. DAVID'S C_____ (Psalm 3:1-2)

- Run to the Lord before running anywhere else.
- The battle is spiritual (Eph. 6:12).
- Cast your anxieties on Him (1 Pet. 5:6–9).
- *“Call upon Me in the day of trouble; I shall rescue you, and you will honor Me.” — Psalm 50:15*

II. DAVID'S C_____ (Psalm 3:3–4)

- Shift your eyes from your enemies to your God.
- God is our Shield, Glory, and Lifter of our heads.
- Key Scriptures: Psalm 33:16–19; Genesis 15:1; Psalm 27:6; Hebrews 4:16
- God hears and answers the cries of His people.

III. DAVID'S C_____ (Psalm 3:5–6)

- Rest because God never sleeps.
- He sustains His people through every night and every day.
- Key Scriptures: Psalm 23:4; Matthew 6:27; Psalm 121:4; Mark 4:35–41
- Faith in God produces fearlessness of man.

IV. DAVID'S C_____ (Psalm 3:7-8)

- God alone saves.
- God's past faithfulness gives present confidence.
- Key Scriptures: Psalm 58:6; Jonah 2:9
- *"Salvation belongs to the LORD; Your blessing be upon Your people! Selah."* — Psalm 3:8



APPLICATION

1. Bring every burden to the Lord.
2. Remember who God is.
3. Rest in His sustaining care.
4. Salvation belongs to the LORD through Jesus Christ alone.
