

Reassurance for the Road Ahead

Scripture: *Genesis 46:1–27*

Introduction

There are moments in life when excitement eventually gives way to uncertainty. What first feels joyful and full of possibility can suddenly become heavy once reality settles in. Questions begin to surface about the future, the cost, and what lies ahead. Genesis 46 reminds us that even faithful believers need reassurance during seasons of transition. Jacob is leaving what is familiar and stepping into the unknown, yet through it all God reminds him that His presence and promises remain secure.

1. The D_____

Genesis 46:1

- Jacob leaves Canaan with “all that he had.”
- Obedience often requires leaving what feels familiar and secure.
- Faith continues moving forward even when questions remain.

Key Truth:

God often stretches our faith through seasons of transition.

2. The D_____

Genesis 46:1–4

- Jacob stops at Beersheba to worship before entering Egypt.
- God reassures Jacob of His presence and faithfulness.

Key Truth:

Worship becomes the doorway through which reassurance comes.

3. The D_____

Genesis 46:5–27

- The genealogy reveals God’s covenant faithfulness.
- Every name listed is evidence that God keeps His promises.
- Egypt would become the place where God grows Israel into a nation.

Key Truth:

God’s faithfulness does not depend upon the perfection of His people.

Application

For Believers

- Trust God in uncertain seasons.
- Seek God before reacting emotionally.

For Unbelievers

- True reassurance is found only through Jesus Christ.
- Christ promises never to forsake those who belong to Him
