-In other words, The Blessed Life is the life that has asked for pardon from God.

Example: Saul On The Road To Damascus- The Blessed Life is the life that has been shown mercy like Saul, who humbly accepted God's mercy and was saved.

2. Your Heavenly Father wants you to be _____ with His mercy.

- Not only are you invited to experience God's mercy, you are encouraged to be filled with God's mercy.
- This is what happened to Saul. Unlike The Parable Of The Unforgiving Servant (Matthew 18:23-35)
- By Christ's one act of mercy on Saul, Saul's life changed.
- The Blessed Life is a life that is filled with the mercy of God toward others
- Being filled with God's mercy for others is a prerequisite for effective evangelism.
- The Blessed Life is the life that recognizes God's mercy on them, is filled with joy and excitement about God's mercy, and is willing to live the rest of their days from that place of mercy.

3. Your Heavenly Father wants you to _____ mercy to others.

- Saul, after he was shown mercy by Jesus Christ, changed his course of action.
- The Courage Of Ananias: Ananias, who had been shown mercy by God, was now required to be merciful.
- The Blessed Life is one that shows mercy and leads with mercy!
- God gave Ananias an opportunity to show mercy and a miracle happened!
- Jesus miraculously healed Saul's blinded eyes.
- God has miracles in acts of mercy.
- The Blessed Life is the one who lives from a place of mercy, like Ananias.

4. Your Heavenly Father wants you to know, mercy comes ______.

- When you show mercy, you shall obtain mercy. Obtaining mercy does sound difficult, but for those among us who find it hard to forgive themselves, it can be difficult.
- God's _____ is bigger than that mistake!
- The Blessed Life is a life that comes to God, learns to forgive themselves, and believes God to turn their blunders into blessings.
