World History According to God

- The bible gives us a complete timeline of earth's history
- This timeline demonstrates a young earth and leaves no room for an old earth
- Why does this matter?
 - Biblical truth always matters
 - God gave us a timeline with many, specific details.
 - Faith is trusting God, including what He wrote for us.
 - Abraham believed God and it was credited to him as righteousness
 - We are not free to pick and choose the parts of the bible we want to believe.
 - Either it's all right (and of God) or it's nothing more than a human work.
 - A "short" world history better demonstrates God's faithfulness and direct involvement with His creation.
 - The timeline matches the observable scientific evidence far better than a long timeline
 - A long timeline is not needed for an omnipotent God, but is **NECESSARY** for a "naturalistic" (idolatrous) view

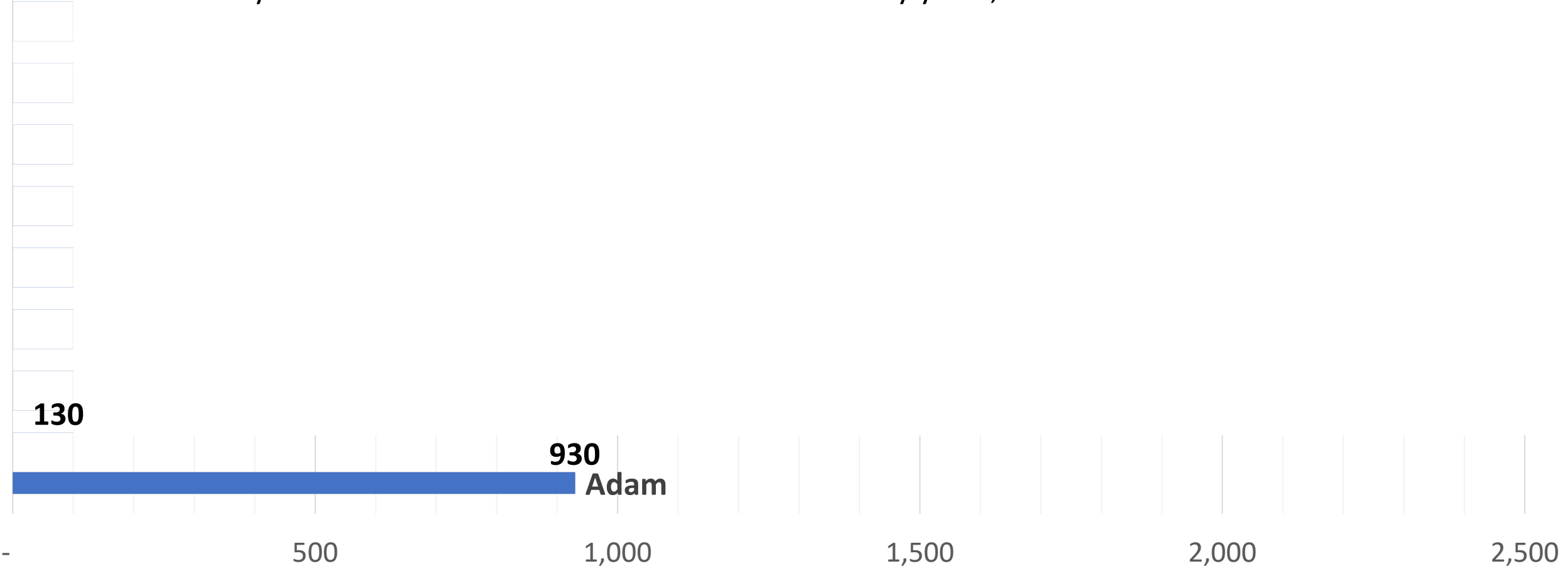
World History - Adam to Flood

Genesis 5:3-5 (NASB)

³ When Adam had lived one hundred and thirty years, he became the father of *a son* in his own likeness, according to his image, and named him Seth.

⁴ Then the days of Adam after he became the father of Seth were eight hundred years, and he had *other* sons and daughters.

⁵ So all the days that Adam lived were nine hundred and thirty years, and he died.



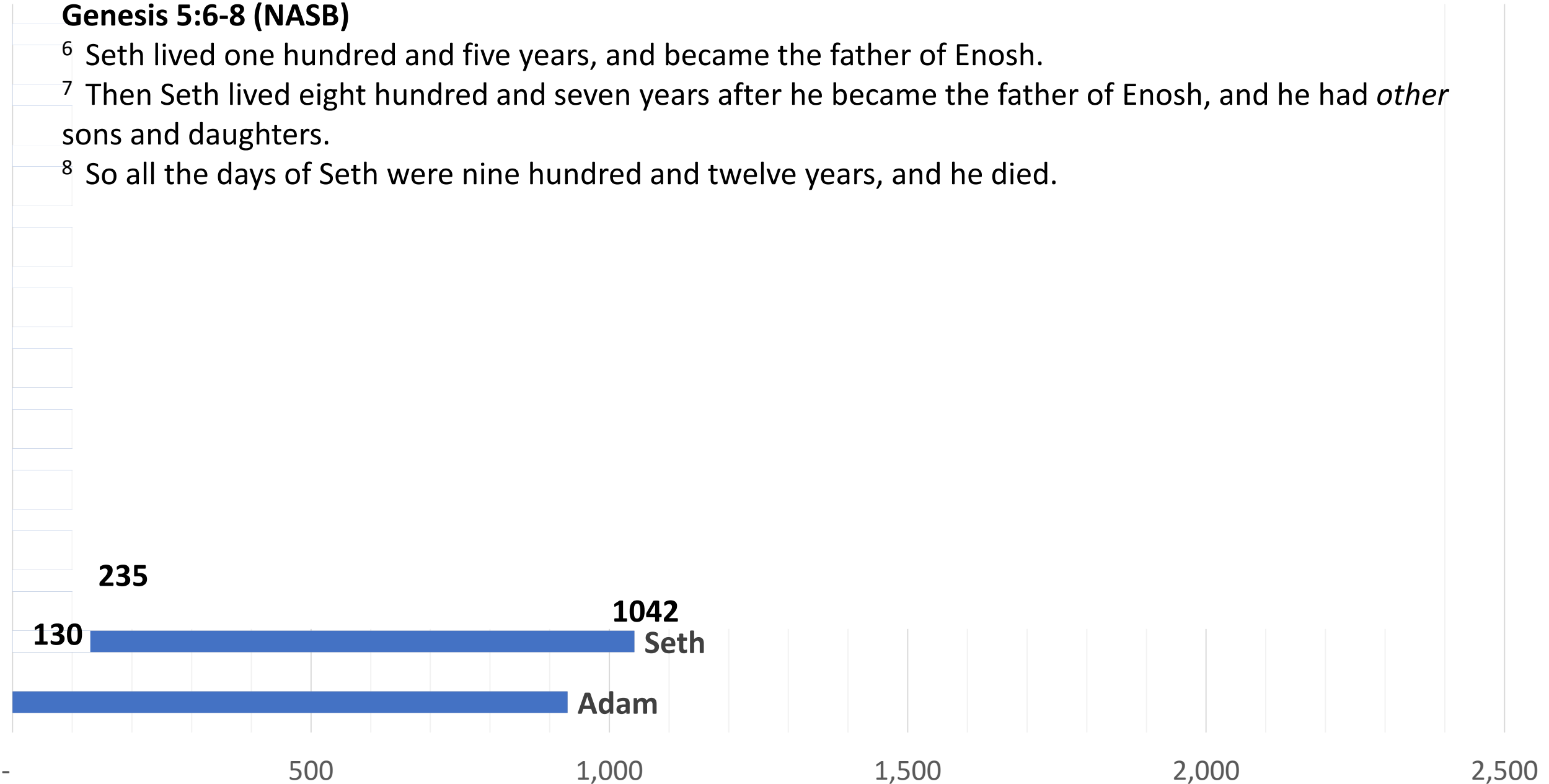

⁸ So all the days of Seth were nine hundred and twelve years, and he died.



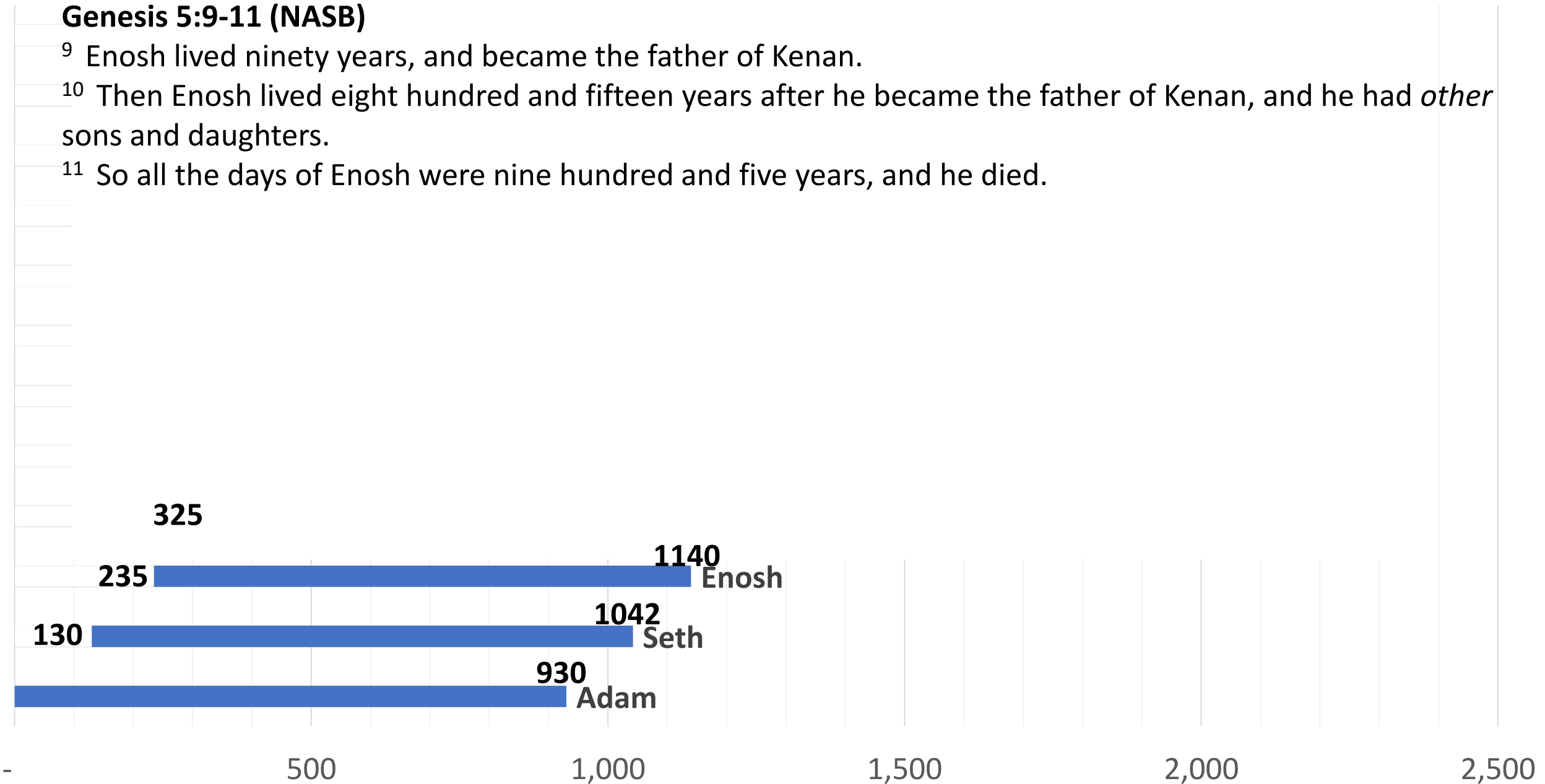

¹¹ So all the days of Enosh were nine hundred and five years, and he died.



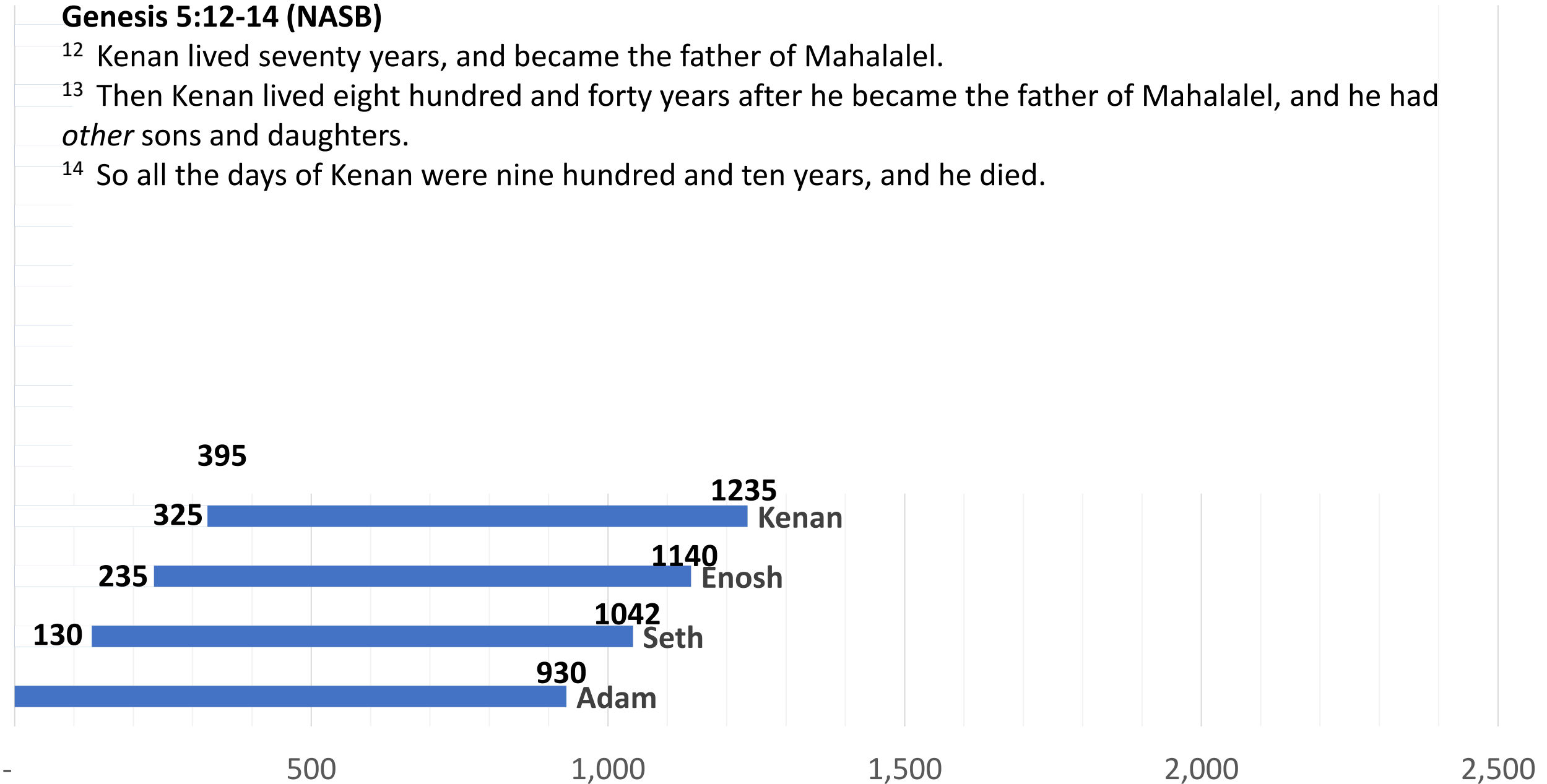

¹⁴ So all the days of Kenan were nine hundred and ten years, and he died.



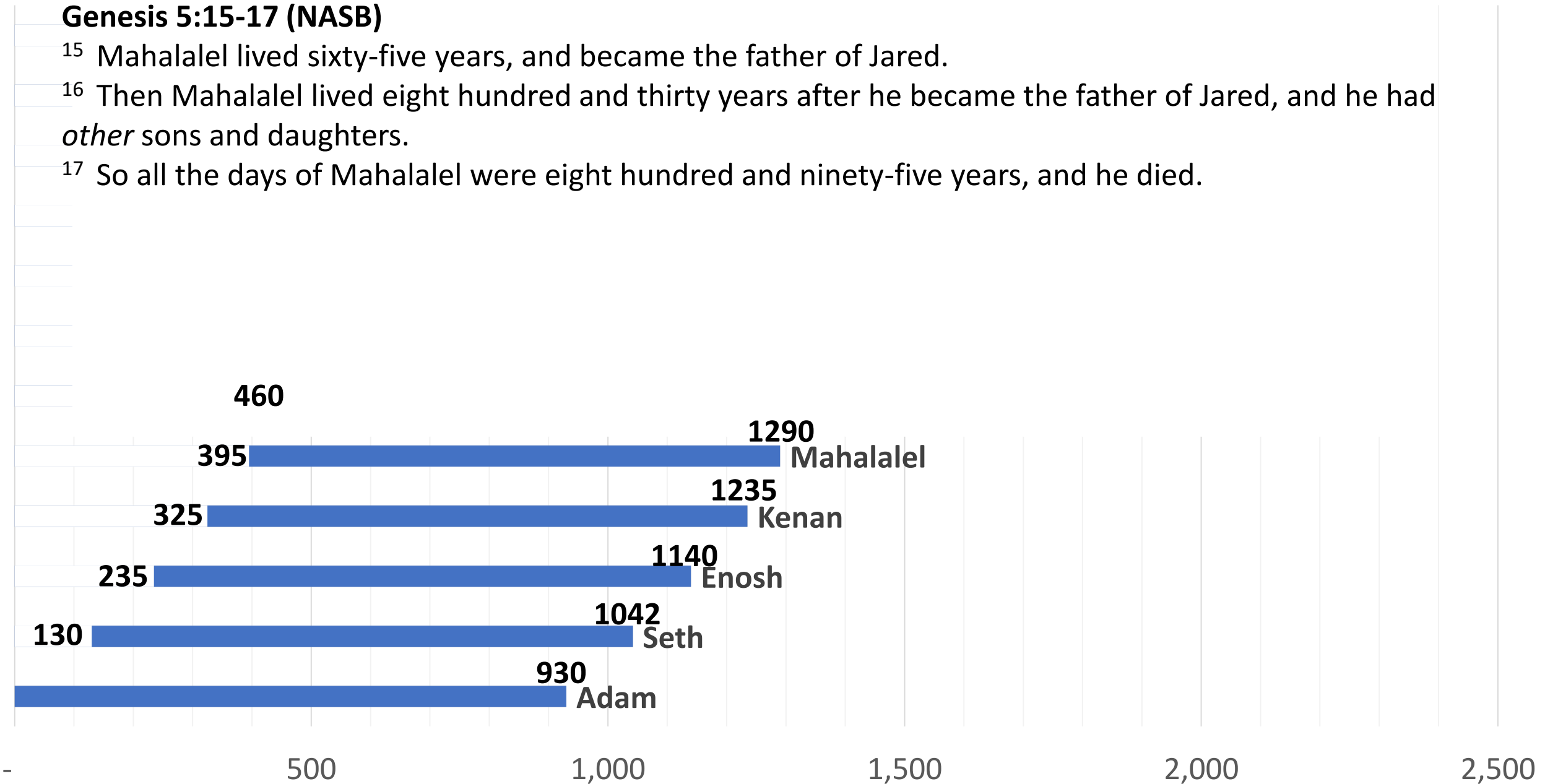

¹⁷ So all the days of Mahalalel were eight hundred and ninety-five years, and he died.



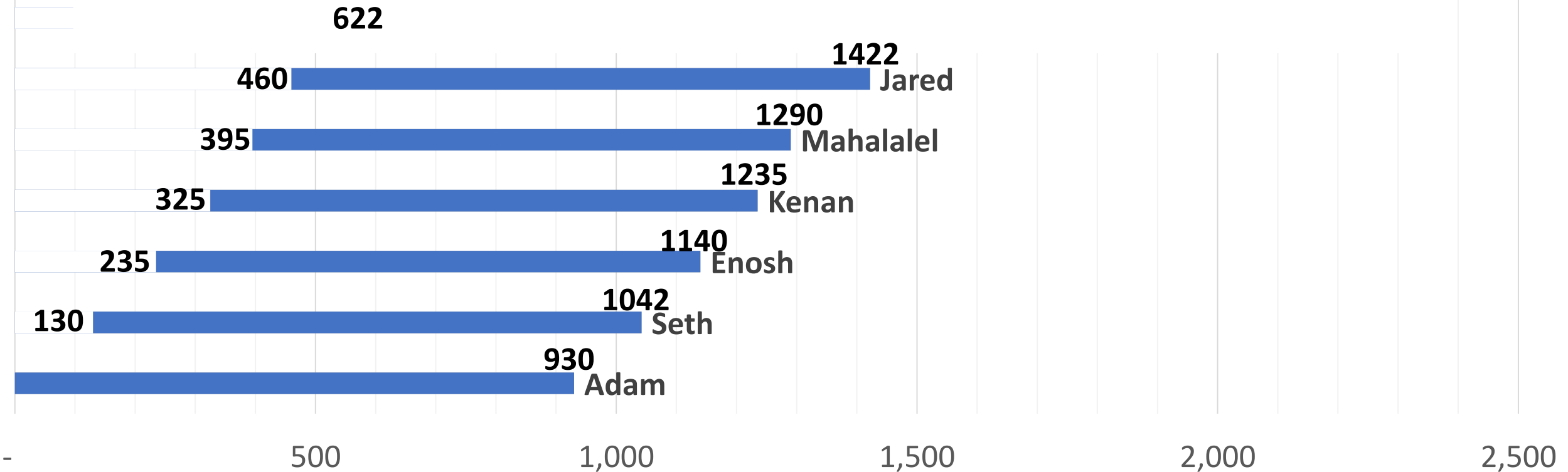

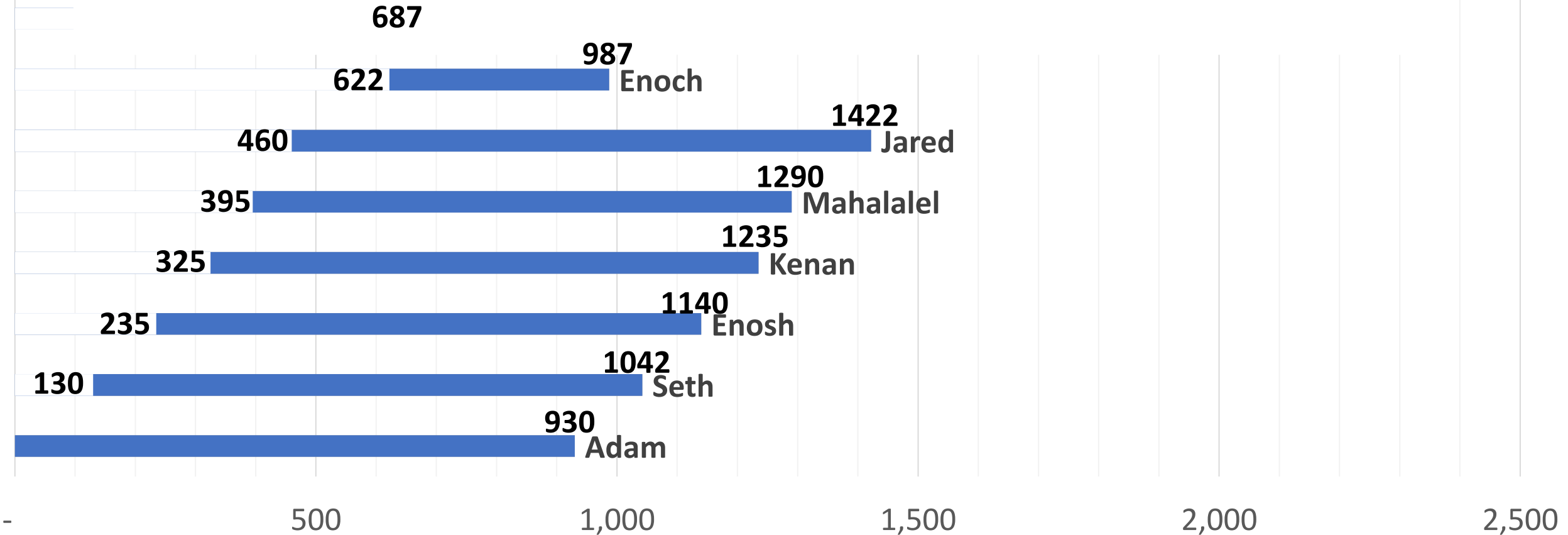

²⁴ Enoch walked with God; and he was not, for God took him.



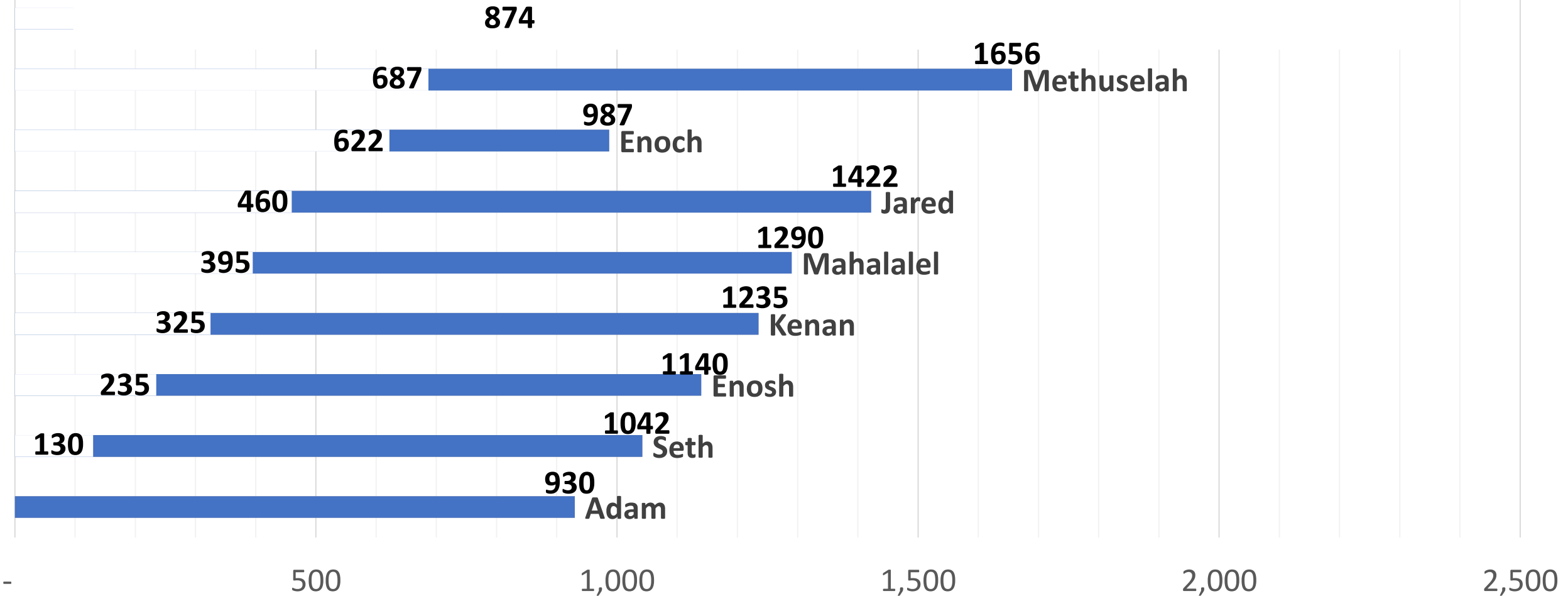

²⁷ So all the days of Methuselah were nine hundred and sixty-nine years, and he died.

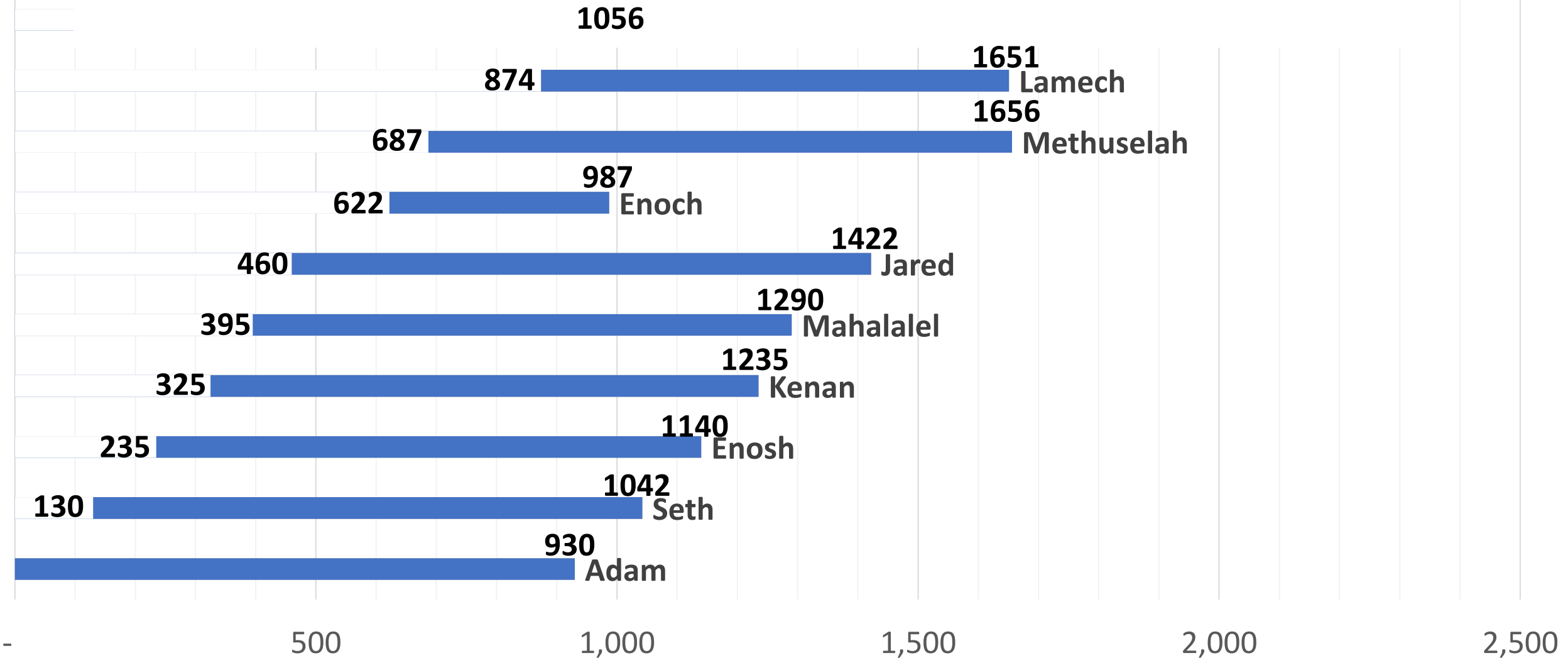

1 Kings 11:42 (NASB) ⁴² Thus the time that Solomon reigned in Jerusalem over all Israel was forty years.

This gives the years that Solomon reigned – 3204 to 3244

Neither David's age when Solomon was born nor the number of years Solomon lived are provided.

However, Solomon began to reign the year David died

⁴ David was thirty years old when he became king, *and* he reigned forty years.

2 Kings 14:21 (NASB)

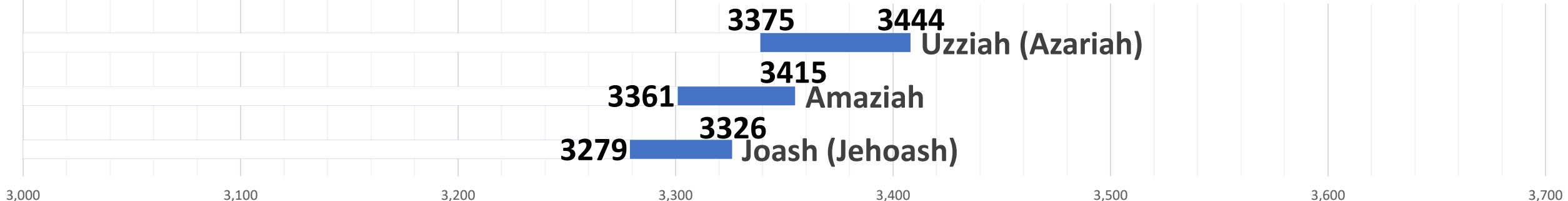
²¹ All the people of Judah took Azariah, who *was* sixteen years old, and made him king in the place of his father Amaziah.

2 Kings 15:27 (NASB) ²⁷ In the fifty-second year of Azariah king of Judah, Pekah son of Remaliah became king over Israel in Samaria, *and reigned* twenty years.

2 Kings 15:32 (NASB) ³² In the second year of Pekah the son of Remaliah king of Israel, Jotham the son of Uzziah king of Judah became king.

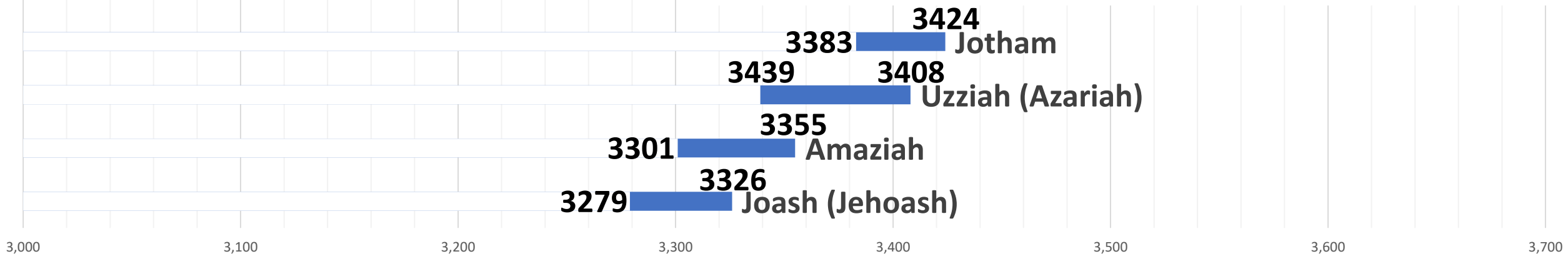
Verses 27 and 32 indicate Azariah reigned 53 years.

A direct reading of 2 Kings causes a 12-year gap, as Amaziah dies 15 years after his defeat by Israel, yet Uzziah is listed as starting his reign in the 27th year of Jeroboam II, while starting in the 15th year of Amaziah. To align the reigns of the kings of Judah and Israel, scholars like Thiele propose that Uzziah began his reign in 792/791 BC, at age 16, while his father Amaziah was still alive, but perhaps incapacitated, in exile, or had effectively handed over power. Co-reigning for 24 years is the view of several scholars

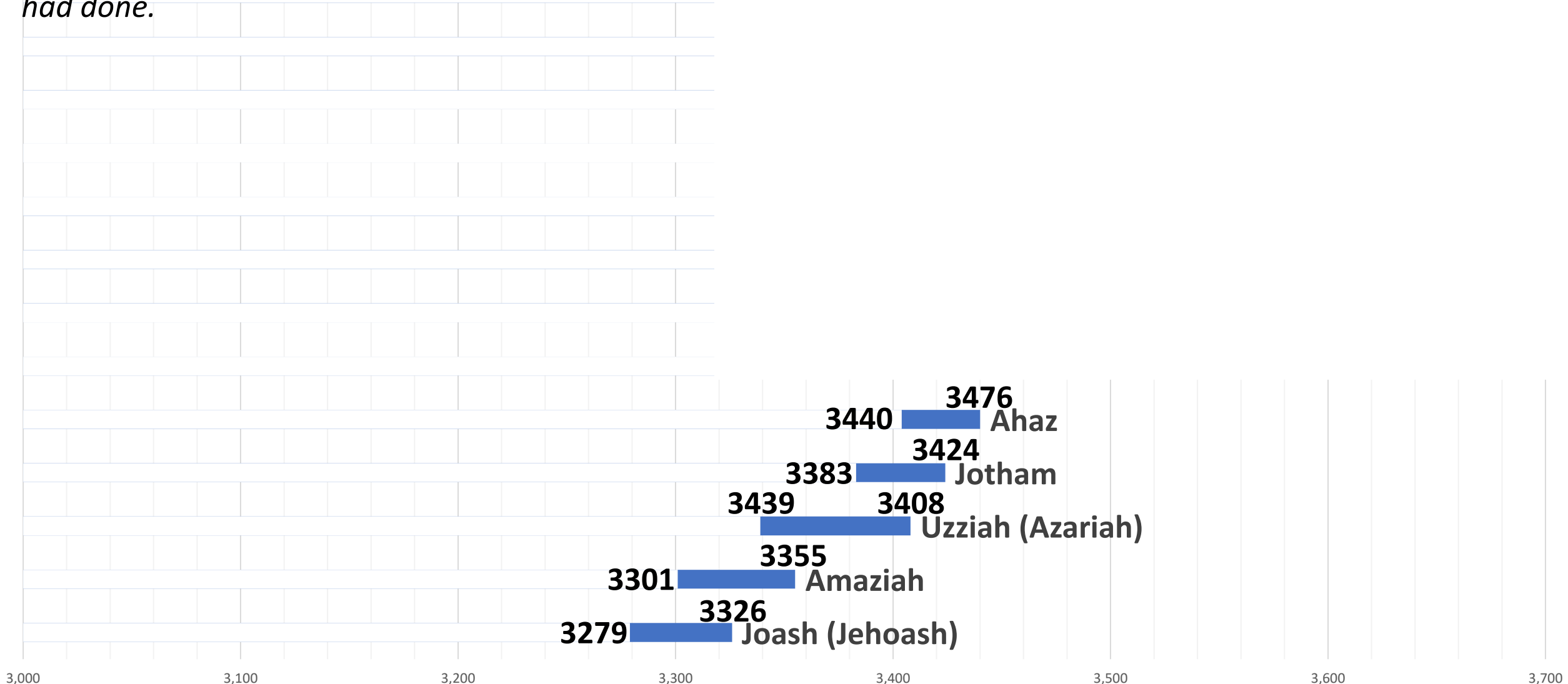

How do we marry the Bible dates to our current dating system?

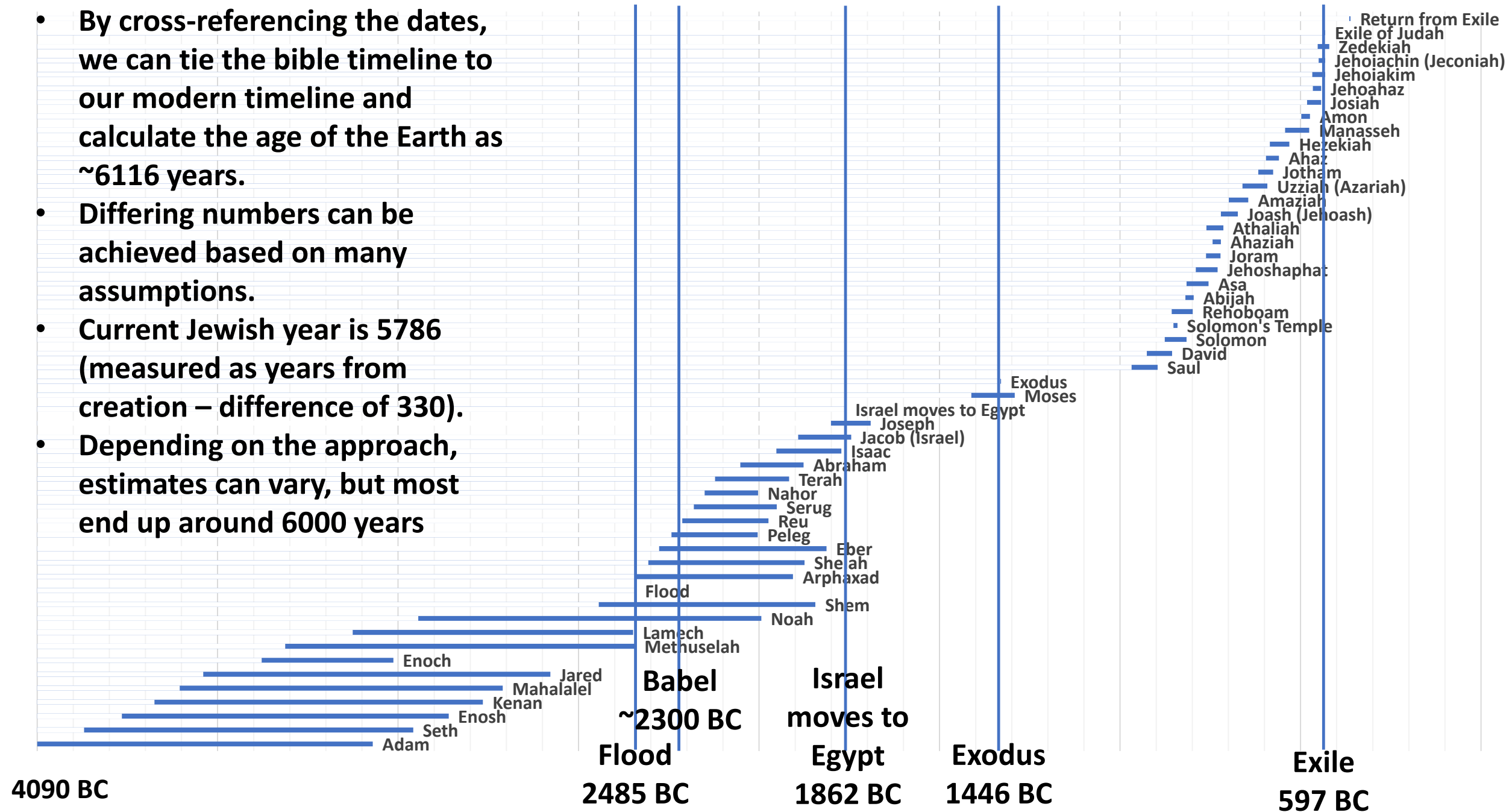
- In 1887 several Babylonian tablets were deciphered. They provided dates of the reigns of many Babylonian kings.
- More tablets, deciphered in 1956, give the dates of Nebuchadnezzar's reign and activities.
- *The Archaeological Commentary on the Bible* explains the significance: "Until 1956, the date of the first conquest of Jerusalem by the Babylonians was not known. But in that year, several cuneiform tablets were deciphered which gave an exact date for the first conquest— in 597 B.C."



Genesis 10:25 (NASB) ²⁵ Two sons were born to Eber; the name of the one was Peleg, for in his days the earth was divided; and his brother's name was Joktan.

World History

- By cross-referencing the dates, we can tie the bible timeline to our modern timeline and calculate the age of the Earth as ~6116 years.
- Differing numbers can be achieved based on many assumptions.
- Current Jewish year is 5786 (measured as years from creation – difference of 330).
- Depending on the approach, estimates can vary, but most end up around 6000 years

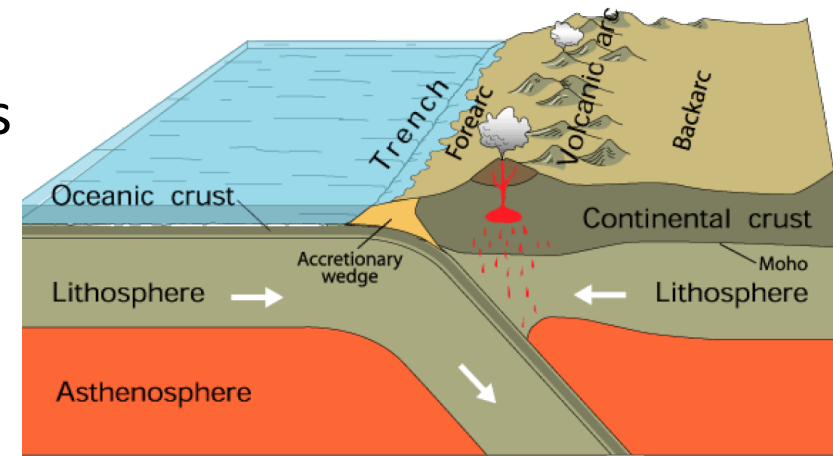


When was the Ice Age?

- Extensive geological evidence exists for an ice age – secular and Christian scientists agree on at least one ice age.
- God's judgement to scatter the people occurred in the time of Peleg, who was born 100 years after the flood. The ice age made filling the earth much easier for animals and humans, with sea levels ~300 feet lower than today.
- **Job 37:9-10:** Describes the "cold from the driving north winds" and ice forming by the "breath of God," suggesting a period of intense, unfamiliar cold.
- **Job 38:29-30:** Mentions "the ice," "the frost of heaven," and waters that "harden like stone," which some scholars interpret as a direct description of the Ice Age's ice sheets.
- **Job 6:16 and 38:22:** Refer to snow and ice in a context that suggests a colder environment than modern-day Arabia, where Job lived.
- This points to a time after the flood and up to the time of Abraham
- Based on this, it seems the ice age was probably active during both Peleg's time and Job's time.

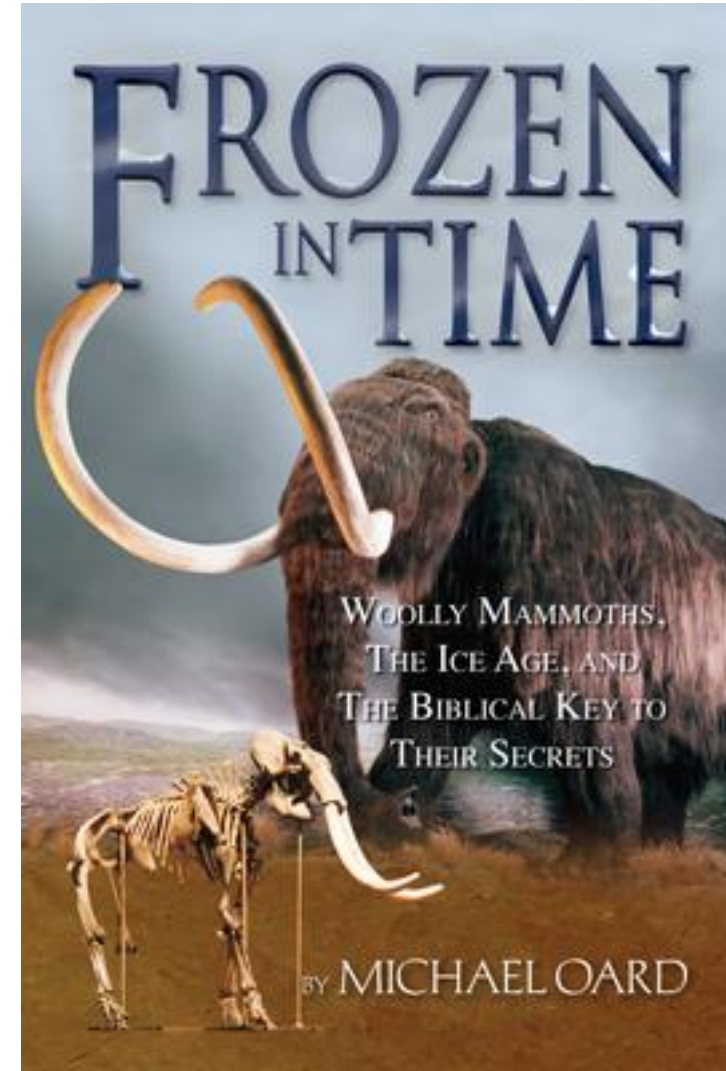
When was the Ice Age?

- An ice age requires massive snow, and much less sunlight.
- No secular mechanism can explain an ice age or periodic ice ages
- Noah's flood is the best explanation for the cause.
- Warm oceans due to the fountains of the deep cause much greater evaporation AND keep coastal areas mostly free from ice.
- Atmospheric particulates from high volcanic activity filled the atmosphere to block sunlight for extended periods of time.
- Secular and Christian scientists tend to agree that the continents were once joined – the geologic evidence is overwhelming.
- Secular and Christian scientists also tend to agree that the tectonic plates of the earth moved, causing the separation of continents we see today.
- Many Christian scientists believe the tectonic plates moved rapidly, mostly during the flood.
- Rapid tectonic plate movement would also warm the oceans and cause extreme volcanic activity



When was the Ice Age?

- After the flood and before the ice age, forests could have formed in Antarctica (proven by drilling cores)
- The time period of the Ice Age is called the “Pleistocene” era, and is when we first have evidence of humans
- Secular view is the Pleistocene era spanned 2.6 million years ago to 11000 years ago.
- Young earth view is about 4400-4000 years ago (from the flood to the time of Abraham)
- Human fossils are very rare from this time, but is generally agreed the time coincided with the end of much of the “mega fauna”, such as the woolly mammoth
- Radiometric dating of the earliest artifacts, animals, and dinosaur bones (killed during flood) supports this younger view (more next week)

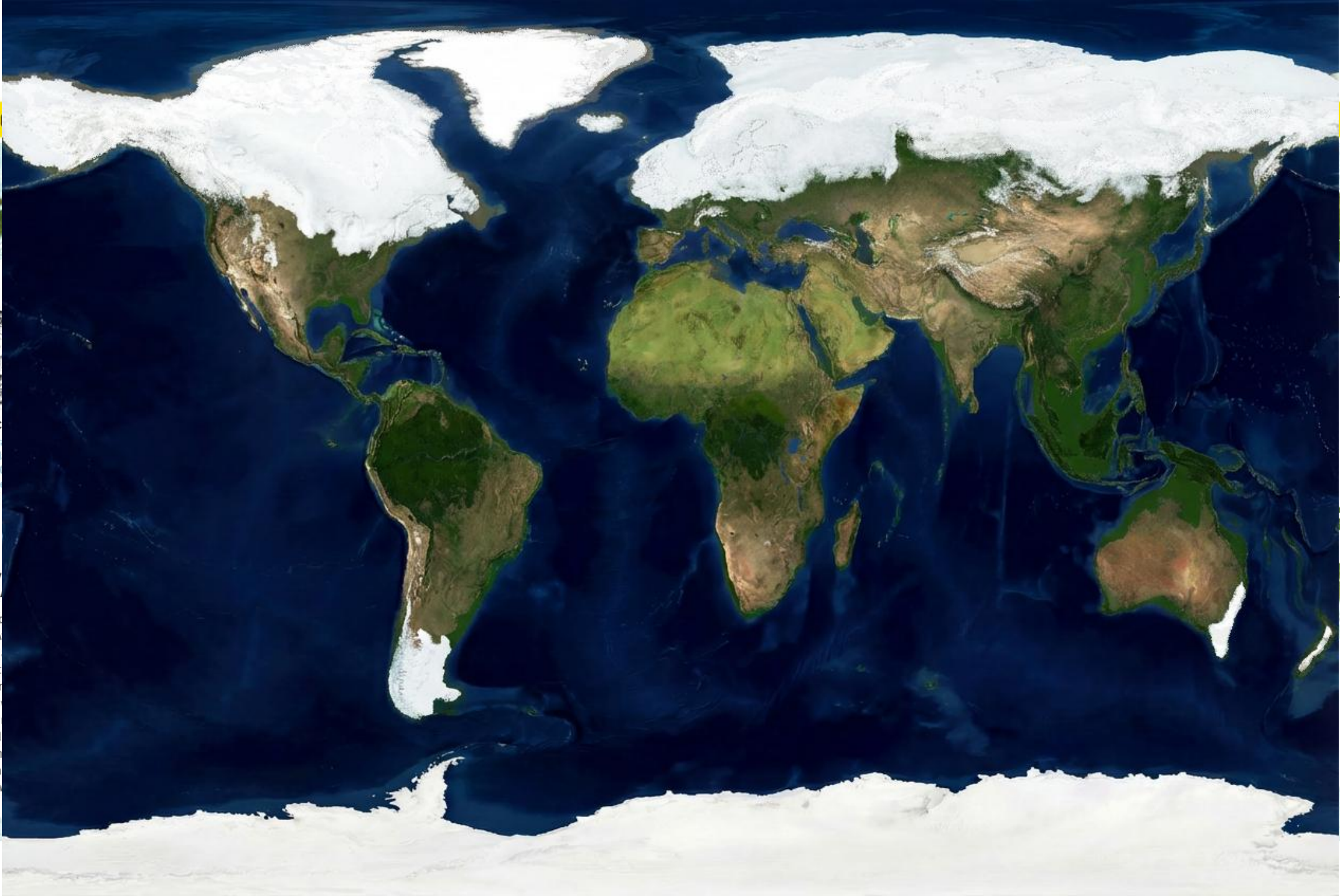

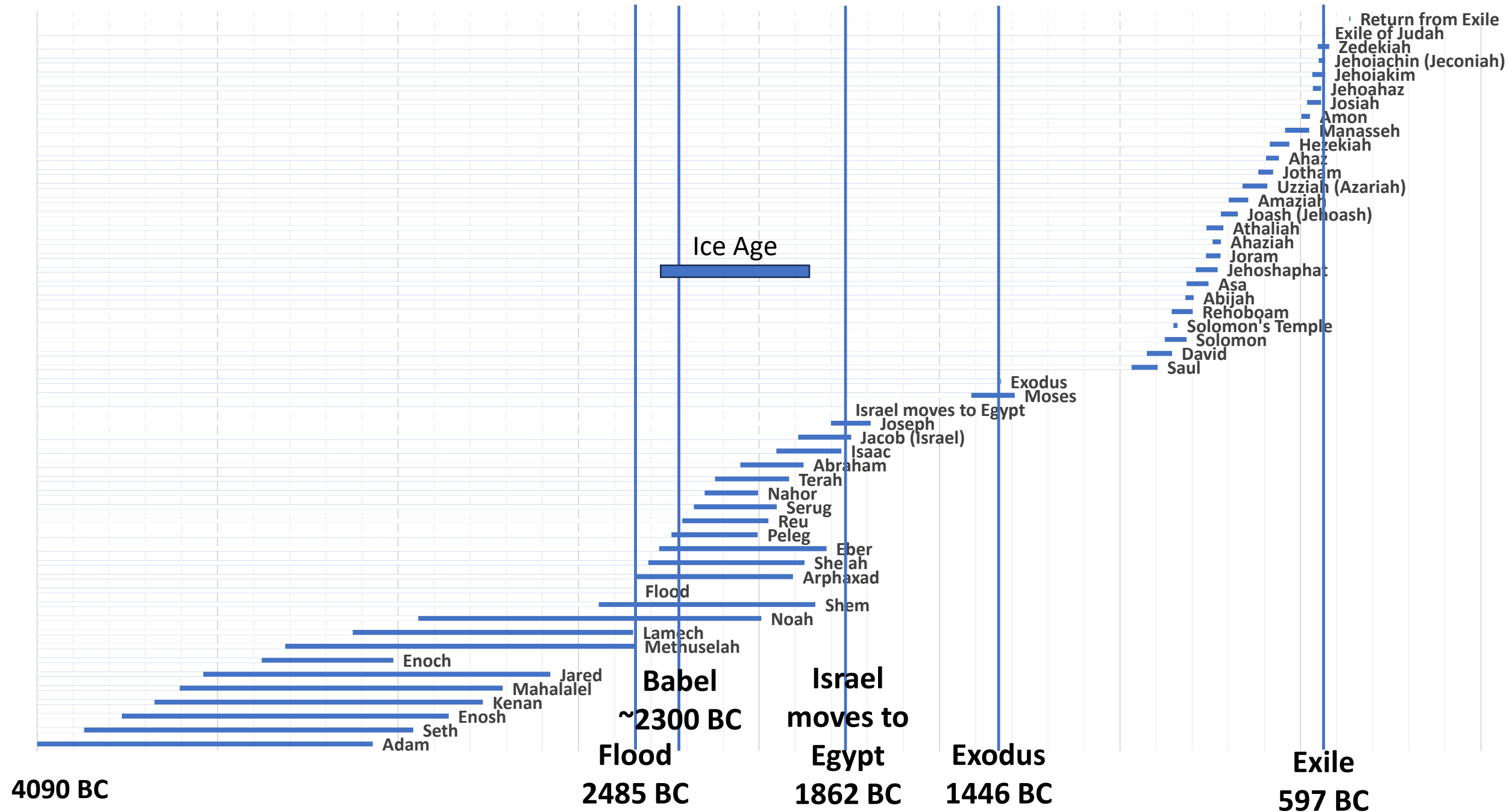

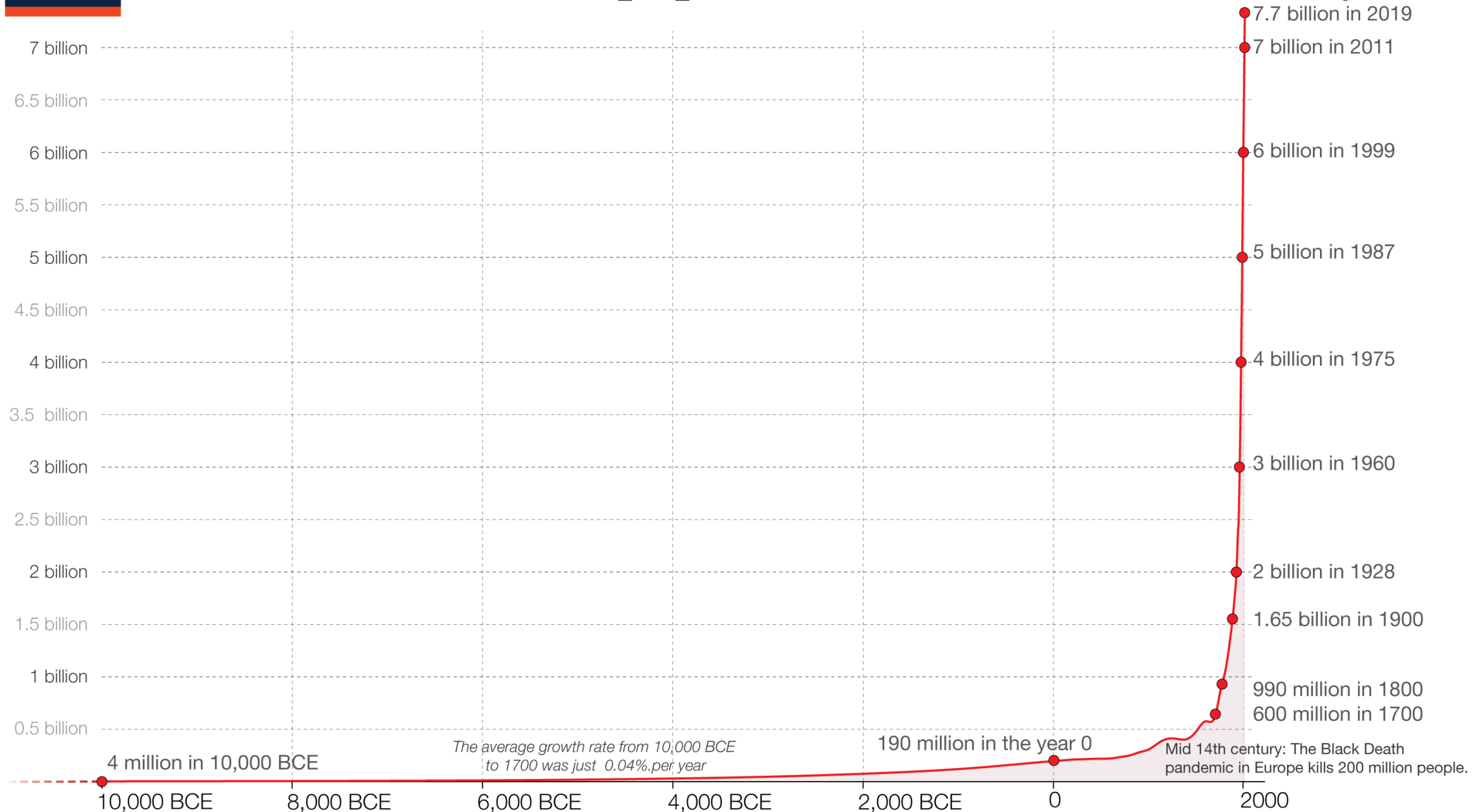

How a Young Earth Changes Perspectives

- The earth is still slowly warming and ice sheets are still reducing since the single ice age. Each year it gets closer to an equilibrium state.
- Ocean levels have risen considerably since the ice age
- 1656 years from creation to destruction, followed by ~2400 years until Jesus came, and subsequently followed by ~2000 more years since Jesus
- A young earth does not allow for incomprehensible amounts of time used to confuse perspectives – a young earth refutes evolution
- The geology that can be observed was overwhelmingly formed by the flood.
- Provides a much more intimate relationship between God and His creation.
