## The Immutable Law of Sowing and Reaping: 5 Day Devotional

Day 1: The Unchanging Laws of God Reading: Galatians 6:7-10 - Devotional: Just as God established immutable physical laws that govern our universe, He has also set spiritual laws in motion. The law of sowing and reaping is one such principle that applies to every aspect of our lives. Day 5: Reaping Eternal Life Reading: John 4:31-38 - Devotional: Jesus speaks here about a harvest of eternal significance - the salvation of souls. While we often think of sowing and reaping in terms of personal spiritual growth or blessings, this passage reminds us of the broader, eternal perspective. Our faithful sowing can have an impact that extends far beyond our own lives, contributing to God's redemptive work in the world. Today, consider how you can participate in this eternal harvest. This might involve sharing your faith with others, supporting missionaries, or simply showing Christ's love to those around you. Remember, some sow and others reap, but we all work together in God's field. Even small acts of faithfulness can contribute to a person's journey towards Christ. As you go about your day, look for opportunities to sow seeds of faith, hope, and love, trusting that God will bring the increase in His perfect timing.
