

## 5-Day Devotional: Stewards of Time

### Day 1: Everything Belongs to God

**Reading: Psalm 24:1-6; 1 Corinthians 6:19-20**

**Devotional:** Before we can understand stewardship, we must grasp ownership. The earth and everything in it belongs to the Lord—including your very breath, your body, and your time. You were bought at a price through Christ's sacrifice, making you a steward rather than an owner of your life. This truth transforms how we view every moment. Your time is not yours to waste or hoard; it is God's gift entrusted to you for His purposes. Today, acknowledge that you belong to Him. Ask yourself: Am I living as though my life is my own, or am I honoring the One who purchased me? Surrender your schedule, your plans, and your moments to the rightful Owner.

### Day 2: The Beginning and End of Time

**Reading: Genesis 1:1-5; Genesis 3:22-24; Job 14:5**

**Devotional:** Time began when God spoke creation into existence, and it became measured when sin entered the world. The curse brought mortality, starting the countdown for every human life. God has determined the exact length of your days—you cannot add a single minute. This reality should not bring fear but urgency. Moses prayed, "Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom." Your time is finite, appointed by God before you were born. Every sunrise is a gift, every sunset a reminder. How does this change your perspective on today? Stop living as though you have unlimited tomorrows. Recognize the preciousness of now and use it intentionally for eternal purposes.

### Day 3: Life is But a Vapor

**Reading: James 4:13-17; 2 Peter 3:8-9**

**Devotional:** James confronts our arrogance when we plan our futures without acknowledging God's sovereignty. We are vapors—appearing briefly, then vanishing. While God exists outside time, where a day is like a thousand years, we are bound by its relentless march. This contrast should humble us. We make plans, but we do not control outcomes or guarantee tomorrow. The antidote to presumption is submission: "If the Lord wills, we will live and do this or that." Today, hold your plans with open hands. Recognize that while planning is wise, presuming is foolish. Ask God to align your intentions with His will. Live today fully, knowing tomorrow is not promised, but God's purposes will prevail.

### Day 4: Redeeming the Time

**Reading: Ephesians 5:1-17**

**Devotional:** Paul commands us to "redeem the time, because the days are evil." To redeem means to buy back, to rescue from waste. Every moment spent in sin, frivolity, or spiritual lethargy is time stolen from Kingdom purposes. Walking as children of light means purposefully maximizing opportunities for God's glory. This requires vigilance—testing what pleases the Lord, exposing darkness, pursuing holiness. The culture around you wastes time on empty pursuits, but you are called to live differently. Examine your calendar, your habits, your entertainment. What are you buying back for God? What are you surrendering to darkness? Wake up from spiritual slumber. Choose wisdom over foolishness, intentionality over drift, eternal impact over temporary pleasure.

### Day 5: The Eternal Turning Point

**Reading: 2 Corinthians 5:10; Acts 17:24-28**

**Devotional:** This brief moment in time determines your eternal destiny. When your appointed time expires, the condition of your spirit—redeemed or unredeemed—seals where you will spend forever. We will all stand before Christ's judgment seat to give account. This is not meant to terrify believers but to awaken the complacent. Have you turned from sin and called upon Jesus to save you? Are you His, bought with His blood, sealed by His Spirit? Do you have full assurance of salvation? If not, today is your turning point. God appointed your times and boundaries so you would seek Him and find Him—He is not far from you. In Him you live, move, and exist. Do not let this day pass without settling your eternity. Respond to His grace now, while it is still called today.
