

5-Day Devotional: The Hope of Glory

Day 1: The Mystery Revealed **Reading:** Colossians 1:25-27 **Devotional:** For generations, humanity searched for meaning and purpose, longing for something beyond this temporal existence. Paul reveals the profound mystery that was hidden but is now made known: Christ in you, the hope of glory. This is not merely a theological concept but a living reality. The Creator of the universe chooses to dwell within believers, transforming them from the inside out. This indwelling presence is your guarantee of eternal life and your source of hope in every circumstance. Today, pause and reflect on this staggering truth: you carry within you the hope of glory. Let this reality reshape how you view yourself and your future.

Day 2: Peace Through Justification **Reading:** Romans 5:1-2 **Devotional:** Through faith in Christ, you have been declared righteous before God. This justification is not based on your performance but on His grace. The result is peace with God—not an uneasy truce, but genuine reconciliation. You now have access into His presence, standing in grace rather than judgment. This access is not temporary or conditional; it is your permanent position as His child. The hope of glory is not wishful thinking but a confident expectation rooted in what Christ has already accomplished. As you face today's challenges, remember you stand in grace. You are not working toward acceptance; you are working from acceptance.

Day 3: The Longing for Immortality **Reading:** Job 19:25-27 **Devotional:** Even in ancient times, in the midst of unspeakable suffering, Job understood a profound truth: death is not the end. Despite losing everything, he declared with confidence that his Redeemer lives and that he would see God with his own eyes. God has placed within every human heart a longing for immortality, for a place where pain ceases and joy is complete. This yearning is not mere fantasy; it is a divine imprint pointing us toward our true home. Job's hope sustained him through darkness because it was anchored in the character of God, not his circumstances. What are you anchoring your hope in today?

Day 4: The Gift of New Life **Reading:** 2 Corinthians 5:17; Ephesians 2:8-9 **Devotional:** Salvation is a gift, not a reward. You cannot earn it, achieve it, or deserve it. God offers it freely through Christ. However, a gift must be received to have value. Many people acknowledge the gift of salvation exists but never personally open it and make it their own. When you receive Christ, you become a new creation—the old passes away, and the new comes. This is not self-improvement or turning over a new leaf; it is supernatural transformation. Have you received this gift? If so, are you living in the freedom and newness it provides? If not, today is the day to reach out and accept what God is offering you.

Day 5: The Invitation to Communion **Reading:** John 13:21-27; Luke 22:14-20 **Devotional:** In the upper room, Jesus offered bread to Judas—a gesture of honor, friendship, and one final invitation to choose love over betrayal. Judas had a choice: remain in Jesus' love or pursue his own path. He chose the latter, and darkness entered. Every time we approach the table of communion, Jesus extends the same invitation to us. Will we humble ourselves and remain in His love, or will we exalt ourselves and walk away? Communion is not merely a ritual; it is an ongoing relationship with the living Christ. He invites you to fellowship with Him, to remember His sacrifice, and to anticipate the day when you will feast with Him in glory—the place where we never grow old.
