God will judge each of us!


- Each must do their roles as unto the Lord, and not as a reciprocation of what the other is doing.


Spiritual Leadership(Father/Daughter)

- Leading in prayer, word, and godly example? (Ephesians 5:23, 1 Cor 11:3)
- Identity and Security Provider; Daughters who are affirmed by their fathers grow up with a healthier self-image
- Role Model of Godly; A father is the first man his daughter sees consistently. He models what healthy manhood and leadership should look like.
- Affirmer of Value and Beauty; A father's words shape how a girl views herself. His affirmation guards her from seeking validation in unhealthy places.
- Teacher of Truth and Wisdom. Fathers play a critical role in passing down biblical instruction and moral clarity.
- Bridge to Understanding God as Father. A father's love and presence shape how a daughter perceives God's love. A godly father reflects the tender, strong, faithful nature of God the Father.
- Guardian of Purity and Boundaries. A father helps his daughter understand healthy boundaries and guards her purity until marriage.
