AGAPE – The Love That God Defines

Introduction

- Love is a central theme in the Bible: God's love for humanity, Christ's love, and the love we should show toward God and each other.
- Without love, even good works are meaningless ("we are nothing").
- The sermon's focus: Love in its highest form—Agape.

Body

I. The Biblical Concept of Love Surpasses Ordinary Definitions

A. English vs. Greek Words for Love

- 1. English uses "love" broadly (for God, food, etc.).
- 2. Greek distinguishes types:
 - a. Phileo: affection for friends
 - b. *Eros*: sensual/physical love (not used in N.T.)
 - c. Storge: natural affection (e.g., parent for child)

B. Agape: The Highest Form of Love

- 1. Not just an emotion, but a choice of will to act in another's best interest—even for the undeserving and at personal cost.
 - 2. Key characteristics:
 - a. Not simply an emotion
 - b. A choice of will
 - c. Active toward imperfect objects
 - d. Willing to sacrifice

C. Scriptural Examples

- 1. John 3:16 God's sacrificial love for the world
- 2. Galatians 2:20 Christ's love for Paul, despite his past
- 3. 1 Peter 1:22 Command to love one another fervently

II. Developing and Maintaining Agape Love

A. Education

- 1. Learning what the Bible teaches about Agape
- 2. Responsibility to study, reflect, and apply scripture

B. Determination

- 1. Must choose and commit to practice Agape
- 2. "Whosoever will"—it's a choice

C. Imitation

- 1. Following God's example (e.g., loving enemies as God does)
- 2. Jesus as the model for Agape

III. The Practical Value of Agape in Three Key Relationships

A. Love for the Lost

- 1. Evangelism motivated by love for God and the lost
- 2. Seeking the best interests of others, even if undeserving (What they need most)

B. Love for Brethren

- 1. Love within the Christian community is essential
- 2. Without love for brethren, one cannot truly love or know God

C. Love for Family

- 1. Agape in marriage: no problem is unsolvable if both practice this love
- 2. Agape in family: no problem is unsolvable if all practice this love
- 3. Love can restore, rebuild, and bring joy
