Key word construction - waw consecutive

The "waw consecutive" is a grammatical construction that links verbs together to indicate a sequence of past actions, crucial for narrative flow.

It's formed by adding the Hebrew letter "waw" indicating that one action follows another



Waw consecutive

"Moses repeats the waw consecutive, which is an essential characteristic of the narrative adding to the past narration an element of sequence, helps to identify it as such."

(Kaiser 2001, p. 80).



Waw consecutive

"Appearing 55 times in the 34 verses in Genesis 1:1-2:3, the waw consecutive is consistent with the narrative material found in the remainder of [the book of] Genesis."

(McCabe 2008, p. 217)

Yahweh – The Covenant Keeping God

Genesis 2:10-14

"The similarity of certain names (Ethiopia, Euphrates) is best explained in terms of the ascription by Noah and his sons of these names to post-flood features which remind them of pre-flood geographic features, just as the explorers of America often gave European names to American sites and cities.



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Life's Adjustments:

- 1) The Text of Genesis 2:4-25 relates to historical events that demand to be taken in their plain sense. (tôledôt)
- 2) There is no contradiction between Chapter's 1 and 2 of Genesis.
- 3) There is a tight correlation between God's calling into being heaven and earth and His Redemptive plan to save His handiwork.



Life's Adjustments:

- 3) Redemption is a central tenant in the mind of God, existing before the beginning of time.
- 4) We need to have a God centered approach to Worship. He is to be Loved as a Father and Feared as a King--a balance between the poles of "Awe and Intimacy."
- 5) Marriage is a covenant relationship illustrating what is ordained in Christ's relationship between Christ and the the Church. (Eph. 5)



Ephesians 5:25-27:

25 Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself up for her,

26 so that He might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word,

27 that He might present to Himself the church in all her glory, having no spot or wrinkle or any such thing; but that she would be holy and blameless.
