THE LAW OF INCREASE - WHERE YOU SOW MATTERS!

Scriptures & notes for self-study

Introduction

Good ground, where you sow matters. Imagine two farmers with the same bag of seed, one plants on soft fertile ground near a river and the other scatters his seed on a rocky hillside full of thorns. Both worked hard, both had the same potential, but only one reaped the harvest, because only one sowed in good ground. The same is true in life and in the kingdom, the harvest depends not only on what you sow but where you sow!

The soil matters.

Matthew 13:23 NKJV

23 But he who received seed on the good ground is he who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and produces: some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty."

- The condition of the soil determines the success of the seed.

1. Not all ground produces the same harvest

- Hard Ground: The word never enters.
- Shallow Ground: Receives quickly but has no root.
- Thorny Ground: Crowded by worries and worldly distractions
- Good Ground: Open deep and fruitful.

2. The soil represents the heart

- Make sure that your own soil is fruitful.
- When your heart is soft towards God, His word can grow and bear fruit.
- Your heart is the first field you must tend.

Proverbs 4:23 NKJV

23 Keep your heart with all diligence, for out of it spring the issues of life.

3. Be wise where you sow

- Discernment matters.
- Sowing good seed and what is good soil?
- The specific seed, needs specific soil.

- When you sow into God led, spirit filled, fruitful places, you can expect multiplication.

Proverbs 3:9-10 NKJV

9 Honour the Lord with your possessions, and with the firstfruits of all your increase; 10 So your barns will be filled with plenty, And your vats will overflow with new wine.

4. Sow where there is life and fruit

- Good soil is where God's presence and word are active.
- When you are planted in good spiritual soil you will flourish.

Psalm 92:13 NKJV

They shall still bear fruit in old age; They shall be fresh and flourishing.

5. Don't waste seed on unfruitful ground

- Jesus never told us to stop sowing but to sow wisely
- Be selective your seed is precious invest it in people and places that value your seed.

Matthew 7:6 NKJV

6 "Do not give what is holy to the dogs; nor cast your pearls before swine, lest they trample them under their feet, and turn and tear you in pieces.

Practical Examples

- If you are mentoring someone that refuses to change that is unfruitful soil invest in someone else.
- Serve faithfully in a thriving church your seed will grow.

Practical Application

- Ask the Holy Spirit where should I be sowing, my time, gifts and finances and let Him show you the fertile places.
- Evaluate your current fields are you sowing into good soil or unfruitful ground?
- Have the guts to change the soil you do not have time to wait.

Conclusion

Good seed in bad soil cannot grow, but good seed in good soil multiplies supernaturally. Choose your ground wisely be led by the Spirit, and when you find good soil sow generously because that is where the increase is guaranteed. God's word and your seed will always produce in the right soil.

Isaiah 55:10-11 NKJV

10 "For as the rain comes down, and the snow from heaven, and do not return there, but water the earth, and make it bring forth and bud, that it may give seed to the sower and bread to the eater, 11 So shall My word be that goes forth from My mouth; It shall not return to Me void, but it shall accomplish what I please, and it shall prosper in the thing for which I sent it.
